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## Dear Cold Spring Harbor Families:

The purpose of this letter is to bring your attention to the new Netflix Series - 13 Reasons Why, which is being viewed by many young people in our schools. This series explores very significant issues such as suicide, bullying, depression, anxiety, and sexual assault. The mental health community, at large, has been clear in voicing concerns about the potential risks posed by the content of the series. While we don't recommend that adolescents be encouraged to view the series, the decision as to whether or not to let your child watch the series is a personal one. This series is recommended for mature audiences (rated TV-MA: Mature Audience Only, "specifically designed to be viewed by adults and therefore may be unsuitable for children under 17"); therefore, if you do allow your child to view it, it is strongly recommended that you watch it with your child, so that you can engage in thoughtful conversation about it.
