
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



#### 1.) Pathways

A student must either:

- · pass an additional Regents examination in a different course (mathematics, science, or social studies); or
- pass an additional Department approved alterative in a different course (English, mathematics, science, or social studies): or
- pass a Department approved pathway assessment (Arts, CDOS, World Languages); or
- successfully complete a Department approved CTE program, including the associated 3-part technical assessment; or
- · successfully complete all the requirements for earning the CDOS Commencement Credential.

Reference Multiple Pathways and Department Approved Alternative Examinations.

#### 2.) Appeals

Appeals are subject to local district approval. Reference Appeals, Safety Nets, and Superintendent Determination.

#### 3.) Special Endorsements

Honors: A student earns a computed average of at least 90 on the Regents examinations applicable to either a Regents diploma or a Regents diploma with advanced designation. No more than 2 Department approved alternatives can be substituted for Regents examinations. The locally developed Checkpoint B examination in World Languages is not included in the calculation.

Mastery in Math and/or Science: A student meets all the requirements for a Regents diploma with advanced designation AND earns a score of 85 or better on 3 math Regents examinations and/or 3 science Regents examinations.

**Technical Endorsement**: A student meets the requirements for either a local diploma, a Regents diploma or a Regents diploma with advanced designation AND successfully completes a Department approved CTE program including the 3-part technical assessment.

Reference the <u>Endorsements and Seals webpage</u> or <u>NYS Diploma/Credential Requirements</u> for additional information pertaining to awarding special endorsements to students with exam exemptions due to COVID-19.

#### 4.) World Languages Exemption

Students with a disability may be excused from the required units of credit in World Languages if so indicated on their IEP, but they must still earn 22 units of credit to graduate. Such student who seeks a Regents diploma with advanced designation does NOT have to complete the 5-unit sequence in the Arts or CTE in lieu of the sequence in World Languages in order to meet the assessment requirements for the advanced diploma.

#### 5.) Superintendent Determination of a Local Diploma

Students with a disability who are unable to attain a local diploma through the various safety net provisions may be eligible for a Superintendent Determination of a local diploma under certain conditions. Reference <a href="Appeals, Safety Nets, and Superintendent Determination">Appeals, Safety Nets, and Superintendent Determination</a>.

#### 6.) Exemptions due to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency

Students granted an exemption from any examination due to COVID-19 are not required to pass such specific examination to meet the assessment requirements for any diploma type. Reference the following FAQs: <u>June/August 2020</u>, <u>January 2021</u>, <u>June/August 2021</u>, and <u>January 2022</u> (USHG only).

#### ) Seal of Civic Readiness

A select number of NYS schools will pilot the Seal of Civic Readiness during the 2021-22 school year. Reference the <u>Civic Readiness Initiative</u>.

#### 8.) Family Resources

Three flyers, a tracking tool, and presentation materials are available to support students' and families' understanding of the NYS Diploma Requirements. #### **Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation**

Students seeking the Regents diploma with advanced designation must:

- Meet the credit and assessment requirements for a Regents diploma; and
- Pass two additional Regents exams or Department approved alternatives in mathematics; and
- Pass one additional Regents exam or Department approved alternative in science
  - students seeking advanced designation must pass at least one Regents exam or
     Department approved alternative in both sciences (one life and one physical); and
- Complete a sequence:
  - earn an additional 2 units of credit in World Languages and pass a locally developed Checkpoint B World Languages examination, or
  - o complete a 5 unit sequence in the Arts, or
  - o complete a 5 unit sequence in CTE.

Assessment Combinations for Advanced Designation

Traditional Combination	ELA, Global History and Geography, US History and Government, 3 mathematics, 2 science (1 life science, 1 physical science) = 8 assessments

### COLLEGE TESTING

#### WHEN?

- PSAT: Grades 10/11 (October)
- SAT and ACT: Grades 11 (Winter/Spring)/12 (Fall)

#### HOW?

- PSAT: Register through school (information from counseling center)
- SAT: www.collegeboard.org
- ACT: www.actstudent.org

### WHICH TEST(S)?

- Practice tests available
  - Free and accessible: Methodize (through Castle Learning account)

#### TEST OPTIONAL - COLLEGES?

- www.fairtest.org ❖ Many colleges are test optional
- ❖ Some colleges are test blind

### PSAT/NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test)

Offered at CSH to 10th and 11th Grade Students

♦Only 11<sup>th</sup> grade students are eligible to participate in National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test

Assess: Reading/Writing and Math (Score range: 320-1520)

Results provide insight into strengths and weakness

National Merit Scholarship Program

Nationally recognized program that identifies highest performing PSAT test takers

Must take exam in 11<sup>th</sup> Grade

Could lead to meaningful recognition or scholarship

### **SAT** and **ACT**

- ♦ All colleges accept either SAT or ACT exam
- ♦ Some colleges are test optional <u>www.fairtest.org</u>
- ♦ SAT <u>www.collegeboard.org</u>
  - Assess evidence-based reading and writing, and math (Essay discontinued)
  - Each section out of 800 points
  - Often considered strategy based
- ♦ ACT <u>www.actstudent.org</u>
  - Assess math, English, reading, science, and writing (Essay optional)
  - Each section out of 36 points, with a composite score representing the
  - average of the four sections (Writing is excluded and scaled 2-12 points)
  - Often considered content based

### Developing a Testing Schedule

### Typical Schedule for *Most* Students

- Fall 10<sup>th</sup> Grade: PSAT (optional)
- Fall 11<sup>th</sup> Grade: PSAT (required for National Merit consideration)
- Winter Spring of 11<sup>th</sup> Grade: Take 1 SAT, 1 ACT, and either SAT/ACT a second time (3 total)
- Sept. and/or Oct. of 12<sup>th</sup> Grade: Retake SAT or ACT (whichever exam is best for you)
- Nov. or Dec. of 12<sup>th</sup> Grade: Final (may not get results for EA, ED, ED II Deadlines check with colleges)

### NCAA Recruited Athletes

• Recruited athletes may want to begin this process a full year early (speak to the college coach to understand their expectations)
