The Role of the High School Counselor

Working closely with each student for four years:

Supporting, Learning, Guiding and Advising

- ▶ Our mission
 - ▶ To facilitate each student's personal, social, academic and career development
- ▶ Our objectives
 - ▶ To help students identify their interests and abilities
 - ▶ To assist students: enhance productivity, gain independence, develop self-expression and increase personal responsibility
 - ▶ To foster decision-making and conflict resolution skills to be able to participate in a global society as active and engaged citizens

Counselor's Role with 9th Grade Students

- ▶ Ongoing Academic Monitoring: Review of progress reports and report cards throughout the year
- ▶ October: Counselors meet their 9th grade students
Setting the foundation – learning about the students
- ▶ December: Program of Study Guide posted and shared; academic programming begins for grade 10
- ▶ Spring Semester and End of Year: Guidance, advisement and support
 - ▶ Summer opportunities
 - ▶ Regents and Final exams
 - ▶ Summer School registration

Academic Record: Transcripts

- ▶ **What** is on the student transcript?
 - ▶ All courses taken and grades earned
- ▶ **When** do I see it?
 - ▶ Posted to the portal annually
- ▶ **How** do I know how I'm doing?
 - ▶ Challenging but manageable

Diploma Types & Requirements

▶ **Diploma Types:**

- ▶ Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation
- ▶ Regents Diploma
- ▶ Local Diploma (still available in special situations)

▶ **Requirements – Credits & Examinations**

- ▶ 22 credits (minimum) – specific subject areas
- ▶ Exams – ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies (1) plus one
- ▶ Exams – Advanced Designation, variety of options

Regents Exams

- ▶ NYS Required Exams
- ▶ Annual, based on individual student courses
- ▶ June 2021 – Only 4 exams offered (L.E., Algebra, English and Earth Science). Exemptions in offered in L.E. and Algebra
- ▶ June 2022 – Expected to return to typical exam schedule
- ▶ August 2022- Regents exams offered for students who fail or wish to receive a higher grade

GPA Calculation

- ▶ Calculation is based on all grades with the exception of physical education
- ▶ All Honors and Advanced Placement courses are weighted by a factor of 1.1
- ▶ GPAs are rounded to the hundredth (ex: 3.68)
- ▶ Accelerated courses are NOT weighted
- ▶ GPA vs. weighted GPA

GPA CALCULATION WORKSHEET

Method to calculate GPA and Weighted GPA:
Take the total GPA or Weighted GPA points and divide that number by the total credits earned.

MARKING SYSTEM:
Marks for all subjects, except pass/fail courses are used in computing a student's cumulative grade point average at the end of the 11th grade or in the event that a student repeats a course, only the higher grade is used in calculating the student's average. All Honors and Advanced Placement courses are weighted by multiplying the letter grade equivalent by a 1.1 factor. Accelerated courses are not weighted.

SAT and ACT Exams

- ▶ Standardized entrance exams used by colleges for admission purposes
- ▶ All colleges accept either SAT or ACT exam
- ▶ Some colleges are test optional – www.fairtest.org
- ▶ SAT/ACT results are only part of the application package and often not the most important
- ▶ SAT – www.collegeboard.org
 - ▶ SAT special testing accommodations (844) 255-7728
- ▶ ACT – www.actstudent.org
 - ▶ ACT special testing accommodations (319) 337-1332

Developing a Testing Schedule

Most Students

- ▶ Fall 10th Grade: PSAT (optional)
- ▶ Fall 11th Grade: PSAT (required for National Merit Scholarship consideration)
- ▶ Winter – Summer 11th Grade: Take 1 SAT, 1 ACT, and either SAT/ACT a second time (3 total)
- ▶ Sept. and/or Oct. 12th Grade: Retake SAT or ACT (which ever exam is best for you)

NCAA Recruited Athletes

- ▶ Recruited athletes may want to begin this process a full year early (speak to the college coach to understand their expectations)

NCAA Information

- ▶ Core Course GPA – helps you track your NCAA GPA
- ▶ Grades and SAT/ACT scores matter!
- ▶ Understand the recruiting process for your sport
- ▶ Talk to your coaches and counselor!
- ▶ Register with the NCAA at the conclusion of 11th Grade



NAVIANCE

- ▶ Provides college and career information
 - ▶ Learn about careers
 - ▶ Explore interests
 - ▶ Manage college application material
 - ▶ Allows for CSH Counseling Center to communicate easily
