

### Principal's Corner

Students in grades 2-4, along with their parents, participated in morning labs in which they experimented with carbon dioxide. This week at school we streamed our third West Side Run Commercial using our iPTV system. Thank you to Sam Schneider, Alexa Plancher, and Juliet Quaglia for getting our students motivated for this year's West Side Run, which will take place on April 28th. During indoor recess this week, our students created posters for the Recycling Poster Contest. #### **Placement**

Parental input can be an important part of the placement process. If your child has special needs that are not already known by his/her classroom teacher, you may submit a letter to my attention by April 5th. Please note that letters from past years are not considered. Letters should be sent to the main office (and not via email). Requests for a specific teacher or placement with any specific child will not be honored and should not be included in a letter (or discussion with a teacher).

### West Side Kids Care

Next Tuesday, March 19th, West Side Kids Care will introduce "Kids Unite to Fight" at morning assembly. This program matches West Side students with pediatric cancer patients across the country, allowing our students to provide encouragement and friendship to children who can't attend school themselves. All of our students will have the opportunity to write a short letter to a specific child during recess on that day. The pre-printed note cards include the patient's name, age, state and C.O.L.E.'s Foundation webpage address. Per our instructions, West Side students will sign the letters with their first name, last initial, city and state. If you would like to encourage a potential ongoing relationship via email, please send in an approved e-mail address with your child next Tuesday for inclusion on the notecards. Alternately, any student who completes a card will be given a letter to parents explaining the "Kids Unite to Fight" program and providing his/her sick child's information. Through this information and your guidance, you will have the opportunity to follow the story of your child's new friend and correspond via the C.O.L.E.'s Foundation webpages. As always, the children join us for West Side Kids Care recess activities on a completely voluntary basis - this is a completely optional program. 

### Student Behavior

Students are **expected** to behave properly during after school activities, like they would during regular school hours. Students are to keep their hands, feet, and objects to themselves and refrain from using foul language.

If a student does not behave in a proper manner, the instructor will follow the below procedures.

- 1. Instructor will give a warning to the student and discuss ways to correct his/her behavior.
- 2. Instructor will contact the child's guardian and make them aware of the situation.
- 3. After speaking with the child's guardian, if the child's behavior does not improve, the student will NOT be permitted to attend classes and a refund WILL NOT be given.

Children may not attend after school activities unless they have been registered for the eight week term. This includes children attending play dates.


