Board of Education "Meeting Highlights" February 11, 2014

President's Report...

BOE president Dr. Janice Elkin's report included the following:

Welcome. We held our Community Budget Forum on Tuesday, January 28th at which time Dr. Bernhard gave a very comprehensive and understandable presentation on the various elements of our budget, mandated expenses, state aid, this year's tax cap, and the impact of the these factors when crafting this year's budget and planning for the future in the context of unpredictable parameters. Dr. Wilansky and Ms. Bellino followed with a second comprehensive presentation of the scope of our academic and extracurricular programs as well as a discussion of class size and a look at class size among are cohorts in other Long Island school districts. Their presentation made it apparent that we continue to provide our children with a very rich overall academic experience. Community members were offered the opportunity to share comments and suggestions with the board. We will now continue the budget process by conducting meetings with building administrators and program directors in which the board will have an opportunity to review and prioritize budget requests. These meetings are open to the public.

In addition Dr. Wilansky, Mrs. Helen Daly and I attended a Western Suffolk Legislative Meeting in which many of our legislators spoke about issues related to the governor's proposed education budget and aid to Long Island Schools, as well as concerns about the manner in which the Common Core, primarily its testing, have been implemented in New York. It was a meaningful exchange, and I believe that our local representatives have listened and comprehend the concerns of parents and educators that relate to the implementation timeline.

Mrs. Daly our Central Parents Council president invited Senator Carl Marcellino to last Thursday's CPC meeting. Senator Marcellino explained some of the mechanics of creating the state education budget and gave some history about state aid and funding in NY. He also spoke about issues related to pre-k funding and responded to parent's concerns about the implementation timeline of common core based regents testing. I would like to thank Senator Marcellino, Mrs. Daly and all of the parents who attended for a very informative discussion.

We are very excited to hear from our virtual enterprise students this evening. Our students continue to demonstrate their talents in many arenas. Many of our athletes and teams have earned personal and team honors as they move into playoff and championship rounds. These include, but are not limited to: girls track, varsity boys basketball, varsity girls basketball, varsity wrestling, and varsity boys swimming and Diving.
