Dear Parents,

The Social Emotional Feeling Words for this month are belong (kindergarten) and accepted (first grade). The teachers are reading books to the children to exemplify the feelings and engaging them in discussions about the tenets of our School and Classroom Charters which say: "We all want to feel included" and "We will be nice to everyone and invite people to play." Our Spirit Day Assembly on January 29th will have the theme: "Count Me In" based on a wonderful song and video produced by the creators of Sesame Street. Connections have been made to the life and work of Martin Luther King, Jr. The discussions focus on acceptance of differences and respect for all people. As we honor Dr. King's birthday on Monday, I hope your children will share some of what they have learned in school about his life. I know you will also have important conversations with your child when you complete the Feeling Words homework this month and share a story with your child about a time you felt (or didn't feel) accepted or a sense of belonging.

Our students are also learning the power of the written word. They are writing "how-to" books in first grade and learning how to teach others through their writing. The kindergarten students have been learning to write their own stories and to write about what they observe. Mostly they are learning that what they write has an impact on an audience. Recently, when students from Mrs. Gross's class approached me about having a school pajama day, I asked them to write me a letter. Upon receipt of it this morning, I made a school announcement. Their letter convinced me that we should have Pajama Day this month! There is no better way to learn the power of writing than to have your words make a change in the world! (Our Pajama Day will be on January 31^{st} .)

Thank you to the GPFA for a wonderful workshop at Wednesday's meeting. Nutritionist Kim Gilroy shared some terrific insights and tips for ways parents can incorporate positive nutrition and wellness habits into their children's lives.
