Head Lice

Although I do not wish to raise undue concern, I would like to address the topic of head lice. Cases of head lice occur in all schools throughout the year and typically increase immediately following school vacations. Our staff is educated about the topic and continually remind children to avoid head-to-head contact, which is the most common method of transmission. It is important that parents have accurate information and work with schools to reduce the number of cases in the community.

According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, infestations of head lice are a very common occurrence in school-aged children. At Goosehill, we respond to reported cases by informing the parents in the child's class so that they can inspect their children and monitor them for symptoms.

With the help of our school nurse, Mrs. Gurtowski, I have collected some current information from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the National Association of School Nurses for your review. If you would like additional information, please see their websites. Here are a few important points to remember:

- Head lice are not an indication of poor hygiene. They do not cause disease.
- Head lice are tiny, wingless insects that live close to the human scalp and feed on blood. The eggs, also called nits, are tiny, tear-drop shaped eggs that attach to the hair shaft. Nits often appear yellowish or white, and can look like dandruff but cannot be removed or brushed off. The adult louse is the size of a sesame seed and is tan to grayish-white. An itchy and inflamed scalp is a common symptom of lice.
- Head lice are mostly spread by direct head-to-head contact—during play, sports activities, slumber parties, or camp. They move by crawling and cannot jump or fly. It is actually uncommon for lice to spread via clothing or personal items, such as combs, towels or toys. The fact is that lice have feet that are specifically designed to grasp onto the human hair shaft and they can only live a few hours off the head. Those that do detach from a person's scalp are most certainly old or injured, and die even more quickly.
- Head lice are not dangerous, but they are upsetting and annoying and require that people spend effort, time, and money to be rid of them. If you suspect your child has lice, it is important to talk to a healthcare provider to discuss the best treatment approach for your family.

With the upcoming school vacation, please remember that children are likely to have close contact during play dates and sleepovers when they sit together on couches and beds and share pillows and blankets. These instances are cited in the medical literature as the most likely sources of transmission of head lice, so check your child carefully following such visits.

Please remember that just as children are susceptible to catching colds and other illnesses, it is possible that they could get lice from close contact with other children. While lice can cause stress for adults, we don't want children to develop fear and anxiety about the prospect of it happening to them. We also don't want children to be ostracized if they do have to be treated for lice.
