HOME SCHOOL

Dear Parents,

It has been another busy week at Goosehill Primary School! The children really enjoyed meeting Alyssa Capucilli and learning about her books. She explained that she writes stories about the people, places, and animals she loves, but adds a touch of imagination too! She also discussed how she researches topics to write informational books, such as My First Soccer Game. The children loved learning that their work in school is just like the work of a "real" author. Ms. Capucilli encouraged them to read, write, and imagine every day. I have heard from a number of parents that their children came home this week and wrote their own books about their pets---just like Biscuit. Meeting an author can really inspire a young writer! Thank you again, to Mrs. Schneider (Petra's mom) for arranging the visit and to the Cultural Arts Committee, GPFA, and our school district for providing the funds for this memorable experience.

The first graders enjoyed their field trip to the Cold Spring Harbor Fish Hatchery on Wednesday. They learned a great deal about a turtle's life cycle, habitat, and adaptations. The program is comprehensive and addresses many of the Life Science Learning Standards for first grade. The children love taking care of and studying their own class turtles, which they will release back into the "wild" (the Fish Hatchery ponds) in June.

The kindergarten students had a wonderful time dancing last night! It really was a joy to watch them have such fun. Thank you to Mrs. Ranaldo for leading them with so much enthusiasm! We are looking forward to the First Grade dance next Thursday.

Goosehill Primary School enjoyed its first-ever chicken parmesan lunch, thanks to Nicolette's persuasive letter! I received a persuasive letter myself this week, from Ava, who made a strong case for having a special kind of Spirit Day this month. Ava suggested that we have "Opposite Day" when students can be creative in finding ways to show *opposites*. Ava and her classmates provided me with examples of opposites, such as wearing socks of opposite colors (black and white), patterns (striped and checked), or design (one lacy, one plain) or wearing something inside-out or backwards. Some children may like the silliness of wearing two different hairstyles (one side down, one side in a pony tail.) We have decided to have Opposite Day next Friday, April 11th. (a half day of school) I hope the children have fun coming up with their opposite ideas! (Please avoid face or hair paint.)

One of the important life-long lessons we hope to instill in the children at Goosehill Primary School is that through the act of writing they can express their opinions and share their stories to influence, teach, and entertain others. Our students are certainly learning the "power of the pen!"

Thank you for attending your child's parent-teacher conference. I hope you'll also consider attending the GPFA meeting on Wednesday at 9:30 a.m. Our teachers have planned a discussion about the math program to help parents support their children. Four teachers will attend the meeting with me to help provide you with insights about the skills and concepts being developed in kindergarten and first grade. Hope to see you there!



Cold Spring Harbor Central School District SHARED-DECISION MAKING SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT TEAM • SELF NOMINATION FORM

We are in the process of putting together our School Improvement Teams (SIT) for the 2014-2015 school year. The purpose of SIT is to improve the educational performance of all students in the schools through the collaborative participation of team members in the decision-making process.

Each school's team consists of teachers, administrators and parents. One of our parent representatives from each school must be a parent of a special education student. Each team is required to meet at least once a month from September to June, and to the extent possible, the meetings will be scheduled at the end of a regular school day. One parent per household, per school enrolled is eligible for nomination. If you are currently sitting as a member of SIT, it is necessary to resubmit your name. The term of office is for one year, not to exceed a three-year term.


