Dear Parents,

Whether you will be home or away on a trip next week, the teachers, staff, and I hope you enjoy the time with your children. As you know, taking a break from school doesn't have to mean taking a break from learning! There are so many ways you can build your child's vocabulary and knowledge base through conversation and exploration while on vacation from school. Here are some ideas:

If your family will be traveling, show your child the place on a map. Notice and name the city, state, or country and nearby landforms or surrounding bodies of water. Use the computer or iPad to view photos and videos of the place to find out a little bit about the land or the people who live there. Just a few minutes of reading, viewing, and discussion can go a long way in building your child's knowledge base about the world.

If you will be staying home this week, there are many opportunities for learning (and fun!) in our area. Try visiting the CSH Library, Fish Hatchery, and Whaling Museum for Spring Break activities. (see flyers in the Items section below) Our local aquariums, zoos, and museums (e.g. L.I. Aquarium, Children's Museum, Cradle of Aviation) make for some wonderful day trips. After a long, cold winter, enjoy some outdoor hiking (e.g. Caumsett State Park, Planting Fields Arboretum) or visits to area playgrounds. Here are some other ideas:
