

# Goosehill Primary School

Weekly Notes-May 2, 2014



Dear Parents,

As part of our school district's partnership with the Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory, the first graders enjoyed their visit to the lab this week where they participated in six exciting activities. Our students used microscopes to examine their fingerprints and explored solids, liquids, and gases. They learned about the brain and even examined a sheep's brain! The scientists taught our students about the properties of liquid nitrogen and how it is useful in the laboratory. They also used paper chromatography to explore the hidden rainbows in colored markers and nature. The children loved the experience and learned so much. We are so grateful that our students have the opportunity to see "real" scientists at work in our own "backyard"!

In school, our students are fascinated by science! Teachers share poems and informational texts about living creatures, physical science, and the environment. All of our students engage in exciting science investigations on a regular basis. It is wonderful to witness their delight as they explore such topics as the water cycle, force and motion, space, magnets, and sound.

The goal of children's development in science is to build their understandings about how the world works and how science is practiced. Hands-on experiences help our students form theories to explain "how" and "why" things happen. In school, they use tools like magnifying glasses, measuring cups, rulers, and scales to gather information. They make predictions, record their ideas on charts, and "try things out." Our teachers help our students use language to ask questions, describe what they see, and draw conclusions.

Here are some ideas for ways parents can nurture scientific thinking at home: (from the National Science Teachers Assoc.)

Observing: Invite young eyes and fingers to notice small details.

- "What shapes do you see in that spider web?"
- "Does the crust on this bread feel different from the crust on that one?"

Classifying: Put things in groups based on their characteristics.

- "Let's sort the socks by color."
- "Can you think of a way to divide your toys according to a pattern?"

Predicting: Put ideas about how the world works into words and test them.

• "How long will an ice cube last sitting on the counter? Will it last longer on another surface?"

Quantifying: Encourage children to quantify the world around them.

- "Who is the shortest person in the family? By how much?"
- "How many steps big is your room? The living room?"

The most important thing you can do as a parent is encourage a sense of wonder in your child. Talk and read about interesting topics. Pose questions like the ones above and look for answers together. Visit the library and take your own field trips to explore the natural world. Just remember...science is all around us!


