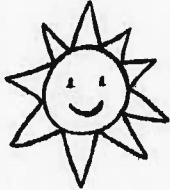
## Field Day

### Field Day is TUESDAY, JUNE 10<sup>th</sup>!

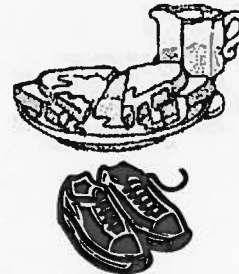

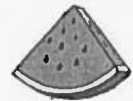
Parents are invited to attend! Younger siblings are welcome.

## **Weekly Notes from the GPFA:**

Please remember to order your school supplies for the 2014-2015 school year. When paying your schools dues, remember that if you have children in 2 different schools, make sure you have added the dues for each school when checking out. If all of your children attend the same school, then only one dues payment is required per family.

For example: If you have children at Goosehill AND Lloyd Harbor/West Side, you will need to add your child's Goosehill pack(s) and one GPFA dues to the cart AND your child's LHS/WSS pack and one PTG dues to the cart. If you just have children at either Lloyd Harbor or West Side, then you just need to add the pack(s) and the one dues per family regardless of how many packs you buy. It is important to remember you are paying one dues payment for each school your children attend, regardless of how many packs you purchase. ## Summer Science Programs

### **FORENSIC SCIENCE (FS)**

Focus on the science of forensics in this hands-on look at crime scenes! Collect evidence, recreate a crime scene, and identify suspects as you learn the science of sleuthing. (Children entering grades 2-6)

### **JUNIOR ROBOTICS (JR)**

This introduction to robotics explores basic circuitry, mechanical science, and robot building. Each camper works daily on a robot to bring home at the end of the week! (Children entering grades K-3)

### **ROBOT ENGINEERS (RE)**

Discover the science of robots! Learn how different robots work and use their components to explore what is around them. Use your engineering skills to build a working robot to take home! (Children entering grades 3-6)

### **ROBOTS & REACTIONS (R&R)**

Work with robots and create chemical reactions as we uncover the nuts and bolts of the universe. Each camper builds a working robot to take home! (Children entering grades 2-5)

### **ADVANCED ROBOTICS (AR)**

Learn about how different robots operate. Put your robotic knowledge to the test! Use your skills to build your very own Robotic Arm to take home! (Children entering grades 3-6)

## GROUP DESCRIPTIONS

Children are placed in groups of no more than 15 and guided by experienced educators. All education staff is first aid and CPR certified.

### Chickadees (ages 4-6)

This group is for the curious and creative. Children will enjoy storytelling, crafts, games and exciting outdoor explorations which make this hands-on program stimulating and fun.

### Blue Jays (ages 7-9)

Blue Jays are encouraged to take longer looks, ask questions and make connections with their surroundings. Activities are designed with their increasing abilities in mind.
