Dear Parents,

As Halloween draws near, I would like to share some thoughts with you about the day and how we like to approach it at Goosehill Primary School.



While young children can get very excited about Halloween, some aspects of the day can be frightening for them. At school, we try to read lighthearted stories and poems with playful creatures and not-so-scary "frights." Our sing-along includes fun songs, such as "*Dem Bones*," and "*Jack-o-Lantern is a Funny Fellow*." Courtesy of the GPFA, all students receive a pumpkin and enjoy decorating it. But with all that Halloween entails in books, in the media, and even in holiday decorations, it is almost impossible to avoid images of ghosts, goblins, and zombies. For some children, it can be empowering to confront the fears that come with these images. However, we are mindful of the impact that scary words and images can have on young children. It is important to remember that many may still need help understanding the difference between what is real and what is imaginary. For these reasons, we ask that you please avoid costumes that represent things that are very frightening or gory. Remember, children at this age love to be superheroes, animals, and princesses!

If your child shows signs of distress about Halloween or any other issue, please let his/her teacher know. Our school social worker, Mrs. Fuller, is also available to provide parents with tips and strategies for addressing children's fears.



Our Halloween sing-along and parade is meant to be an opportunity for children to show off their costumes and have some special fun in school. For safety reasons, please consider the following guidelines:

- ✓ The costume should be simple enough for your child to change out of independently or safe and comfortable enough to be worn all day.
- ✓ All children (whether they change or remain in their costumes) need to be wearing safe footwear in school. Please don't send your child with heels, slippery shoes, or shoe covers that cause a slipping or tripping hazard.
- ✓ Hats should be easily removed and should not cover the eyes. (No masks, please.)
- ✓ We ask that all accessories be left at home, as they can be a distraction/danger to children. There is also the possibility that they can be lost or damaged.
- ✓ We prefer that children not come to school with their hair spray-painted.

Please remember that food, especially candy, cannot be distributed in school.

We are looking forward to a fun-filled day for the children! Thank you for your support.

Homework Requests

If your kindergartener or first grader is home sick from school for one or two days, it is not necessary to request homework. When your child returns to school, his/her teacher will decide what instruction s/he needs and if there is a homework assignment that is essential practice, it will be sent home with your child that day.

If your child is out two or more days, you may request homework when you call the nurse to report his/her absence in the morning (631-367-5950). The teacher will be notified and will leave some work in the school office for you to pick up at the end of the day. (after 2:15 for kindergarten and after 3:15 for first grade) Please know that we cannot provide homework if your child is absent for reasons other than illness.

Parent Portal Now Available For All Grades

The portal is the only place to see NYS Grade 3-8 Test Results

Dear Parent or Guardian:

The Cold Spring Harbor school district has extended access to our electronic parent portal to parents of all students.

What information will I have access to?

Different grade levels have access to different information.

Grades K through 3 – Report cards and attendance

Grades 4 through 6 – Report cards, attendance and results for prior year's New York State standardized tests in ELA and Math, as well as Science (last year's grade 4)

Grades 7 and 8 – Student schedules, attendance, progress reports, report cards, teacher grade books and results for prior year's New York State standardized tests in ELA and Math

Grades 9 through 12 – same as 7 and 8, and unofficial transcripts.

How can I apply for access to the portal?

Note that if you already have an account (because you have a student in the Jr/Sr High) there is no need to create another. You can see all your children's information from your existing account.

You can apply for an account online by visiting our website at www.csh.k12.ny.us and selecting Parent Portal on the left.

When applying online, you will need to have the following information handy:

- Parent/Guardian Name (apply using one parent's name only; you can create separate accounts for each parent if you like)
- Student Name
- Student ID Number (can be found on schedule/progress report/report card – this is the same as your child's lunch ID number)
- Student Grade Level
- School

We hope you find this system helpful in staying informed of your child's progress.

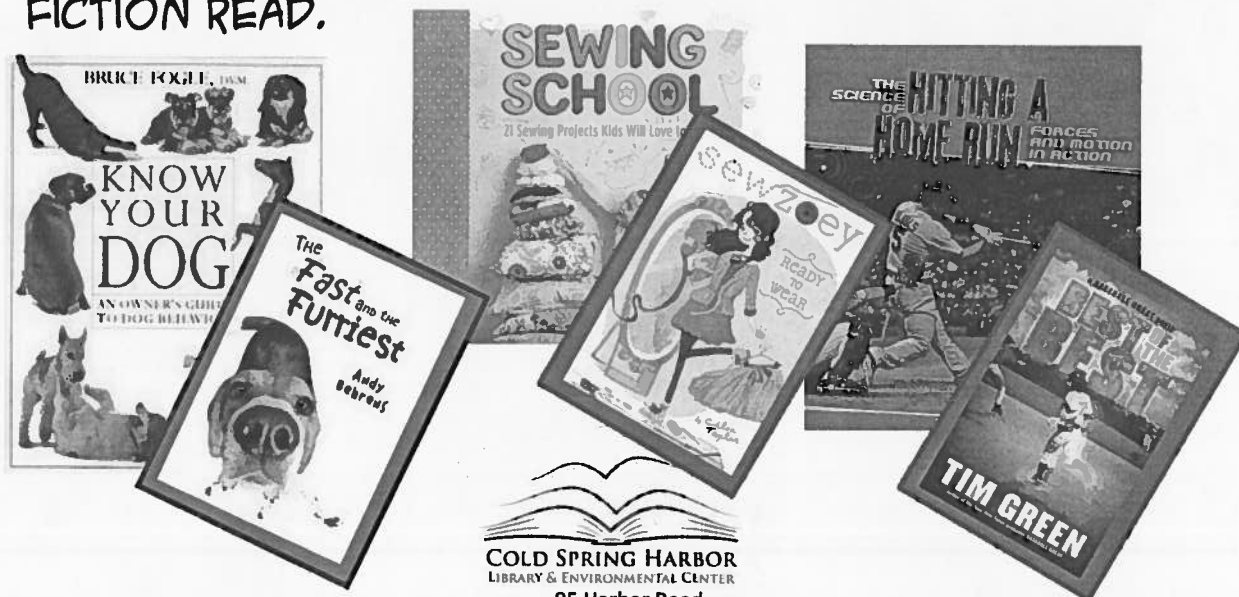

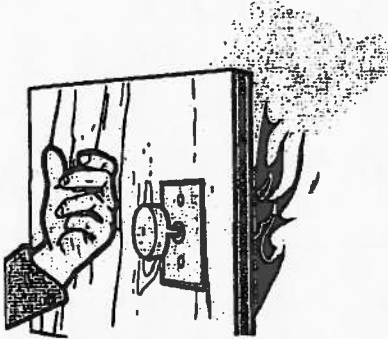

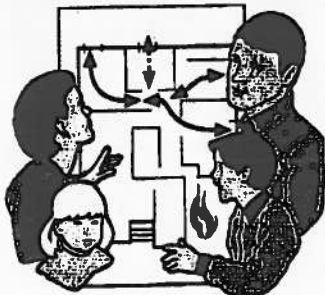
1. Feel the door to check if it's HOT!

SMOKE DETECTORS

Most fatal residential fires occur while the occupants are asleep. Installing smoke detectors outside bedroom areas will provide the extra minutes of warning needed to escape. The most recent figures available from the National Fire Incident Reporting System indicates that the installation of a Smoke Detector will double your chance of survival during a fire.

DEVELOPING THE PLAN

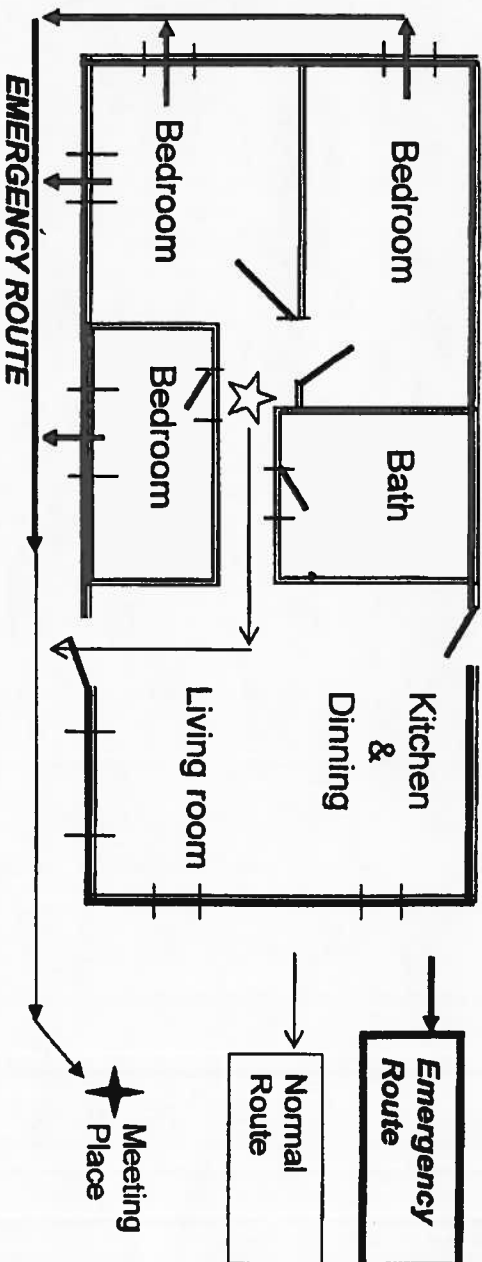
Members of the family should work together to draw a plan of each floor of your house where bedrooms are located.

Your plan should include:

- The location of Smoke Detectors.
- Two escape routes; one for normal and one for Emergency use.
- All doors, windows, stairways, fire escapes and adjacent buildings.
- A central meeting place outside your home.

If a window is designated as an Emergency Route, make sure the person who uses it is able to reach and unlock the window, remove the screen and / or the storm window, reach the ground safely.

Designate someone to call the fire department from a neighbor's house. Post a copy of your finished plan in a conspicuous place as a constant reminder.



PRACTICE YOUR PLAN ON A MONTHLY BASIS AND REMEMBER THESE IMPORTANT HINTS:

- Sleeping with bedroom doors closed can add valuable minutes of protection against flame, smoke and toxic gases.
- If you have a telephone in your room, have the Fire Department's number on it or nearby.
- Keeping a whistle, horn, or other such audible signal near your bed may prove valuable in waking other members of your family who may not hear the smoke detector. If family members use a different signal you will know who is awake without opening doors.

PUTTING THE PLAN INTO ACTION

If the smoke detector sounds or you smell smoke, wake your family with your signal.

If you hear another signal answer with yours. Keep Calm. Roll out of bed and crawl to the door. Feel the door from bottom to top. If it is hot near the top do not open it. Proceed to your designated emergency exit.

If the top of the door is not hot, brace your foot and shoulder against it and open it carefully. If there is only light smoke, crawl to the normal exit. If the smoke is dense or the door is hot use the Emergency Exit. Report to the designated meeting place.

Notify the Fire Department from a neighbor's house. **DO NOT ALLOW ANYONE TO RE-ENTER THE BUILDING FOR ANY REASON.**
