

### Goosehill Primary School Weekly Notes- October 11, 2013



Dear Parents,

At Goosehill Primary School, we are committed to providing our students with a balanced education. Our academic program is complemented by a Social-Emotional Literacy (SEL) curriculum based on the work of Dr. Mark Brackett of Yale University. The program is called "The Ruler Approach." Ruler is an acronym for the skills we teach children to support their emotional well-being and developing social skills. We teach them to: Recognize, Understand, Label, Express, and Regulate their emotions so that they are able to build positive relationships, manage stress, and learn at high levels.

The Feeling Words component of the program involves vocabulary development so that children learn to label and understand emotions. Thank you for taking the time to do the family homework assignment supporting the children's understanding of words related to feeling "excited." Your stories about times when you felt *excited* or *thrilled* were shared in class and helped the children see that all human beings experience similar emotions.

Another component of the curriculum involves the development of classroom and school charters. The children contributed their ideas to their classroom charter the first week of school and this week signed their names to the school charter they helped to develop. We use the language of the charter throughout the school day. For example, when a child is kind or helpful to a peer, we compliment him/her on how s/he is following our charter. Conversely, if a child breaks a rule we remind him/her about the charter and the positive ("helpful") choices and behaviors that are expected in our school. Here is the text of our school charter:

In our classrooms, in the lunchroom, on the playground and bus, and in our hallways, we want to feel... safe, comfortable, calm, happy, excited, welcome, included, good, important

### What will we do to make sure we all feel this way?

Use nice words. Keep our bodies to ourselves. Don't pop anyone's bubble! Listen to adults. Follow the rules. Use indoor voices in school and on the vans. Invite people to play. Stick up for each other. Help and Share. Show you care. Take Meta-Moments

What should we do if someone doesn't live by our charter? (If someone is mean, or hurts us with words or actions...)

Tell them, "Please stop," and "Be nice." Remind them of our Charter. Tell an adult.

Give them an "I" message. ("I feel sad when you tell me I can't play.") Don't do it back.

### If someone doesn't learn and breaks the charter again: (consequences)

Tell him/her to sit and be calm.

Write a sorry note.

Tell the teacher/principal. The teacher/principal will call parents.

S/he will lose a privilege. (something fun, like recess).

The staff and I hope you'll take some time to read through the charter with your child and talk about the ideas it contains. We encourage you to use the language of the charter at home. Some families have even created their own family charters! The greater our home-school connection, the better able we will be to support our children's growth in all areas.






ON HALLOWEEN IN HUNTINGTON VILLAGE




