BOARD OF EDUCATION

The next regular Board of Education meeting will be held on **Tuesday, June 10th** at 8pm at the DO.

4TH GRADE STRINGS/ORCHESTRA

4th grade string students will have early morning rehearsals to prepare for their June 11th concert. The rehearsal dates are on June 4, June 5 and June 11. Rehearsals will begin at 7:45AM in the orchestra room.

4TH GRADE BAND

In order to prepare the 4th grade band students for their concert on June 11th, there will be required morning rehearsals starting at 8AM in the Band Room on the following days: June 4, 6 and 11. To participate in the concert, students are required to attend these rehearsals. Students should bring their instruments and the Essential Elements 200 Book to the rehearsals.

PROPER CLOTHING

As the weather gets warmer, it is important for students to continue to dress suitably for school. Please take a moment to review our guidelines on appropriate clothing (as stated in the Student Agenda Book): Students may not wear short-shorts or flip flops (rubber beach shoes). Sneakers are the preferred choice of footwear. We appreciate the continued support.

DRIVING CAUTION

When driving on the school grounds, be mindful of our traffic patterns and be sure to proceed with caution.

ABSENCES

Your child's absence is being recorded as an unknown and unexcused absence if you do not make a phone call to the nurse's office. Although an absence note is still required, it is not sufficient. The phone call must be made.

AFTERNOON PICK-UP

For safety reasons, we ask that all children being picked up in the back circle wait in line until picked up. Children are not allowed to cross over the parking lot.

EARLY PICK-UP

If you decide, after your child has left for school, that you need to pick him/her up early, it is not necessary to call ahead. Please just come to the front office and we will call your child for dismissal. Back-up notes are still necessary when your child has a change in transportation at the end of the day.

MORNING ACTIVITIES DROP-OFFS

Only those children who have a scheduled morning activity may be dropped off before the 8:30AM start of school. We do not have the personnel to monitor students left here before this time.

AFTERNOON ACTIVITIES - DISMISSAL

All students attending an after-school activity will be picked up at the back circle. Please follow the traffic pattern of the PM dismissal (reverse traffic flow). As always, the safety of our children is paramount. Children are not permitted to cross between cars or through the parking lots.

AFTERNOON BUILDING ACCESS

Please note there will be no access into the school after 4:15pm unless it has been previously arranged.
