Principal's Corner

Welcome back to school! Our first day began with the traditional ringing of the school bell as student council President, Robert Shammah, did the honors during morning assembly. Our students also honored former Principal, Mr. Ted Hilton, with a ribbon-cutting ceremony as we renamed the gym "Hilton Gymnasium." Our Superintendent, Dr. Wilansky, Board of Ed members, and PTG President, Mrs. Reichbach, also attended. Thank you to the PTG for your generous donation to our school which helped to purchase our new basketball goals.

At the Board of Education meeting on Tuesday evening, West Side was honored as it was named a Reward School. Reward Schools are chosen by the state of New York for making the most progress or having the highest achievement in the State with no significant gaps in student achievement.

Throughout this first week, our students participated in a number of activities. Students and teachers collaborated as they made class charters, got to know new classmates through different ice breakers, and actively shared thoughts during DASA (Dignity for All Students) workshops. Students discussed different ideas for enhancing their reading time, discovered new ways to problem solve with team members during math, and reflected on their summer vacation during writing. In Physical Education, students played invasion games in our refurbished gym, and during Art, students studied different artists' interpretations. Finally, our week ended with our Summer Reading Celebration on Friday. Students traveled to various classrooms to work with teachers as they took part in projects connected to their books — a great way to end our first week!

Parent - Performer Contract for the West Side Theatre Association's

The Wizard of Oz (The Musical)

December 14th and 15th 2013

I understand that my child's participation in this performance represents a serious commitment to building a theatre program at the West Side School, as well as being a performer in a successful theatrical production.

Therefore, I agree to the following:

- (1) Contribute a participation fee of \$75 and 4x6 photo of my child on the day of auditions
- (2) Attend all rehearsals every Tuesday and Thursday, from 3:15 to 5:15 PM. There will be no rehearsals on school holidays.
- (3) No student who has missed more than <u>two</u> rehearsals will be allowed to participate in the performance.
- (4) All students will be dismissed from rehearsal at 5:15 in the circle by our chaperone, Ms. Fastuca.
- (5) Any student needing to leave rehearsal early must bring a written note indicating the time and person authorized to pick-up. The authorized person must come in to get the student, and sign the sign-out book.
- (6) All students are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful and appropriate manner, according to the West Side School Code of Conduct.
- (7) We reserve the right to call a parent if behavior is inappropriate or disruptive. If such behavior continues, the student may face dismissal from the production, at the Director's discretion.
- (8) We depend on the goodwill, cooperation, and support of all parents involved in order for our show to be a success, start a strong new theatre tradition at West Side, and for the kids to get the full benefit of this experience.

 Therefore, each family must participate on at least one Committee (see signup sheet).
- (9) I authorize the WSSTA to publish and print my child's photograph and Bio in the *Wizard of Oz* Playbill.


