### Principal's Corner

Congratulations to Timothy Louie (6th grade violinist) and Erin Gallagher (5th grade violinist) on their participation in the Long Island String Festival Association (LISFA) rehearsals and concert last weekend. The students performed at Uniondale High School on March 2<sup>nd</sup> with some of the best string students on Long Island. Way to go!

This week, second graders participated in a lab about circumference using balloons. They also celebrated their realistic fiction pieces and created webs on Inspiration in connection with their character study. Our third graders spent time chunking text as a strategy to stop and think while they read and participated in a lesson about time management. Students in 3D also celebrated the works of several authors who wrote stories that connect to our SEL program. The students' favorite by far was *Hachiko: The True Story of a Loyal Dog.* Fourth graders participated in DASA (Dignity for ALL Students Act) workshops. They took an active role in discussing their responsibilities in the technological world, as well as their interactions with one another. Fifth graders multiplied fractions during math, learned about connections between minerals and cell phones, and presented their Civil War PowerPoint presentations. Sixth graders discussed different strategies for applying ratios and drafted their coat of arms in Social Studies.

On Friday, our West Side Jazz Band teamed up with third grade girls to record "Just Be Kind Now" with the help of Ms. Kleiner, Ms. Levesque, and Ms. Balzano in the band room. The recording supported our Social-Emotional Learning program and Genuine Acts of Kindness Month.

Thank you to Mrs. Genser and Mrs. Weiss for another incredible Talent Show! It was so impressive to attend a show that was truly owned by our students.

#### **Dear Parents:**

In the upcoming weeks, we will begin the process of **student placement for next year**. Our goal is to create balanced classes where all children can thrive academically and socially, while ensuring that district procedures are fair and equitable.

The process of creating classes is a complex one. It involves determining the best placement for each child and the best grouping of students in each classroom. All teachers who have an understanding of the academic and social needs of the students on each grade level have input in this process. Individual learning styles, peer relationships, behavior, and work habits are considered when determining the right placement for each child. In addition, we work carefully to ensure that classes have a balance of boys and girls and a range of abilities.

Parental input can be an important part of this process. If **your child** has **special needs** that are **not already known by his/her classroom teacher**, you may submit a <u>letter</u> to my attention by <u>April 6<sup>th</sup></u>.

### Please note:

- <u>Letters from past years</u> are **not considered**.
- Letters should be sent to the main office (and not via email).
- Requests for a <u>specific teacher</u> or placement with any <u>specific child</u> will **not be honored** and should **not be included in a letter** (or discussion with a teacher).

Please know that we will give the same level of care and attention to the placement of every child, whether a letter is written or not.

I appreciate your confidence in the professional staff as we begin this important process. Thank you for your continued support of our efforts to create an educational environment where every child will be happy and successful.

#### Dear Parents:

As you know, last year Cold Spring Harbor updated the format and structure of the Elementary Report Cards. We are now using our student management system, eSchoolData, to create the reports that you receive. Beginning this marking period, parents will be able to access the report cards on the eSchoolData "Parent Portal". They will be posted and available on Thursday, March 20 by 5 PM.

If you already have a Parent Portal account in eSchoolData (for a child in the Jr./Sr. HS) you are already set up. If this is your first experience with the portal and need an account, please follow the instructions below:

### Setting up an eSchoolData account:

Note: You only need to create <u>one</u> account to access the information for all of your children. In creating an account online, you will need to have the following information handy for <u>one</u> of your children:

- Parent/Guardian Name (apply using one parent's name only) and Student Name
- Student ID Number (can be found on schedule/progress report/report card, also is their lunch system ID number)
- Student Grade Level (as of September 2013)
- School (as of September 2013)
  - 1. Go to the CSH webpage (www.csh.k12.ny.us)
  - 2. Go to the pull down menu "For Parents" and click on "Parent Portal"
  - 3. Scroll all the way down to "How can I apply for access to the portal?" and click the blue link that begins with "You can apply for an account online." Click "Yes" on the pop-up window.
  - 4. The eSchoolData login screen will open. Click on "Online Registration" (bottom of the box).
  - 5. You will be asked to fill out information on three tabs, beginning with the Account Information portion (followed by Personal Information and Student Information).
  - 6. Once all parts have been filled out you will receive an automatically-generated email indicating that your registration information has been submitted. After the data has been reviewed, you will receive an additional email.

### Getting the Report Card:

- I. Log onto your account
- 2. Click on the ID number of your child
- 3. For grades K-5 click on the "ERC" tab
- 4. For grade 6 click on "Report Card" tab
- 5. Click print for a hard copy.

Please know that for the marking period ending this month, Elementary Report Cards will also be distributed at the March parent conferences. In June, the final report cards will be both posted on the portal and mailed home.

Come join DNALC instructors for an introduction to basic microscopy. Microscopes are important pieces of equipment in the lab, but did you know they aren't all the same? Compound light microscopes are used to magnify microscopic samples so they appear hundreds of times larger! Stereo microscopes have a much lower magnification, but allow the user to see samples in three dimensions! Participants will learn how to use two different types of microscopes and view a wide array of both living and non-living samples.

These congregations band together to provide housing, clothing, a hot dinner, and a bag breakfast and lunch to their "guests" during the coldest months of the year.
