Principal's Corner

In second grade this week, our learners continued drafting their persuasive writing pieces which are in the form of reviews. Thank you to the second graders who shared their amazing drafts with me. I read reviews about restaurants, movies, vacation spots, and much more! In third grade, our young scientists measured solids in the lab using scales and a variety of manipulatives. Some of our third graders also got the opportunity to meet with our eSpark consultant to give their feedback about our new iPad pilot program. Our students have a lot to share, and we thank eSpark for allowing them to have a voice. Fourth graders worked on finding an understanding between the decimal system and money in the area of Math, and also participated in discussions regarding strategies they can use when presented with uncomfortable social situations. Fifth graders began constructing volcanoes in small groups in the science lab, concluded their unit on multiplying and dividing fractions, and focused on providing evidence from text to support their thinking in written form. Sixth graders continued their work on their Modern Science Fair presentations. They also received a test analysis assignment which is designed for them to analyze their work and to encourage the self-assessment and reflection process. Be sure to check out the heraldic shields hanging in the sixth grade hallway. I am simply amazed at the talent and ability of our students!



HUNTINGTON INTERFAITH HOMELESS INITIATIVE

Huntington Interfaith Homeless Initiative (HIHI) is a program that provides a safe, warm place to spend the night for homeless individuals who have been living outdoors in the Huntington area. HIHI is run by the Family Service League and is comprised of more than 35 congregations in Huntington Township. These congregations band together to provide housing, clothing, a hot dinner, and a bag breakfast and lunch to their "guests" during the coldest months of the year. CSH High School students volunteer helping the sites set up, serving dinner, and hanging out with the guests. West Side Kids Care completes the CSH effort by providing the breakfasts and lunches to go (25-30 of each). A HIHI sandwich making event will be held on Monday, March 31st from 3:15 to 4:00 in the Cafeteria and will be for 5th and 6th Graders. We will need the following supplies and appreciate all donations you can provide. The items below can be split and donated by multiple people. Supplies can be brought to school with your child, dropped off at the main office during the day, or brought to the cafeteria right after school.
