Principal's Corner

This week our second graders visited the Whaling Museum of Cold Spring Harbor. As you enter their classrooms for parent-teacher conferences, please take a look at the whale words, such as "pods" and "scrimshaw," which are hanging on their walls to support learning the language of this interesting unit. Third graders focused on geometry during math. The word "focused" seems to be an especially appropriate term as it is the Feeling Word of the month for third grade. They also focused on non-fiction reading as they studied various features of a play, including stage directions. This week as I walked down our hallways, I was passed by a number of fourth graders holding clipboards. These young mathematicians surveyed a variety of teachers in our school as they actively engaged in a lesson where they gathered statistical information for their line plots. Fifth graders utilized the computer lab this week to edit their children's menus. Students began the process of creating logos for their companies and will be using Corel Draw, which is a computer program, to enhance their sketches. They also learned how to find the area of three-dimensional objects during math. Our sixth graders continued to work on their science projects and utilized Moviemaker to create their videos. In social studies, they edited their Renaissance PowerPoint presentations about artists of the time period. These technologically savvy students are enhancing their 21st century skills in a number of content areas.

Thank you to fifth grader, Matthew Wright, who addressed our student body at Friday's morning assembly. Matthew is supporting his soccer coach who is a teacher in Queens. A bin is in the airplane wing for students to donate books for this cause. Also, thank you to Dr. Churchland, grandmother of Miles and Alexandra, for coming in to speak to Ms. Dudek's class. Dr. Churchland educated these learners about research, the brain, and the importance of sleep.

We are in the process of putting together our School Improvement Teams (SIT) for the 2014-2015 school year. The purpose of SIT is to improve the educational performance of all students in the schools through the collaborative participation of team members in the decision-making process.

Each school's team consists of teachers, administrators and parents. One of our parent representatives from each school must be a parent of a special education student. Each team is required to meet at least once a month from September to June, and to the extent possible, the meetings will be scheduled at the end of a regular school day. One parent per household, per school enrolled is eligible for nomination. If you are currently sitting as a member of SIT, it is necessary to resubmit your name. The term of office is for one year, not to exceed a three-year term.

If more names are received than slots available, there will be an election. At that time, you may be asked to provide a brief statement and/or reasons for seeking this position in 30 words or less. This statement will be printed on the ballot. Your school association executive board will inform you of the election procedures in April. All elections will be completed by April 30th, 2014. If you have any questions about the SIT committee, contact your building principal.




