Summer Science Programs

NASA - SPACE EXPLORERS (NASA)

Learn about the four forces of flight, the challenges of space travel, and participate in a rocket launch in this hands-on space exploration camp. (Children entering grades 3-6)

FLIGHT ACADEMY (FA)

Explore the aerodynamics of birds, kites and rockets! Build flying machines as you explore Newton's laws of motion. (Children entering grades 1-4)
