West Side Awarded with National Blue Ribbon Honor

Tuesday morning our day began with our usual morning assembly. However, the day was *anything* but usual. At 9:00 AM, as students feverishly worked in class, Secretary of Education, Arne Duncan, broadcasted a historical speech about specific schools around the country. Streamed live on ustream.tv Secretary Duncan spoke of the 2013 National Blue Ribbon award-winning schools. This year, West Side is among the 286 schools to be given the award. A ceremony is scheduled for November in Washington, DC. As the buzz spread through the faculty and staff, the decision was made to announce the news to our students at the same time. Therefore, at 2:30 an announcement was made over the PA system for all students and staff members to meet in the gym at 2:55 for a very special announcement. With the entire school waiting anxiously, I asked a few students to guess how many schools are in the United States. Guesses ranged from 2,000 to 7,000. Their jaws dropped when they heard that there are roughly 132,000 schools in the U.S. and that only 286 of them received the National Blue Ribbon Award this year. Cheers filled the Hilton Gymnasium with the good news as students found out that we are one of them. And so, on Tuesday, September 24th, our day ended, just as it began — with an assembly in the gym.

U.S. SECRETARY OF EDUCATION ARNE DUNCAN RECOGNIZES 286 NATIONAL BLUE RIBBON SCHOOLS FOR 2013

U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan today recognized 286 schools as the 2013 cohort of National Blue Ribbon Schools, based on their overall academic excellence or their progress in improving student academic achievement. Secretary Duncan made this year's announcement live via the Department's USTREAM channel http://www.ustream.tv/channel/education-department, viewed by recognized principals, teachers, and students assembled across the country.

The Department will honor 236 public and 50 private schools at a recognition ceremony on Nov. 18-19 in Washington, D.C. In its 31-year history, the National Blue Ribbon Schools Program has bestowed this coveted award on nearly 7,500 of America's schools.

"Excellence in education matters and we should honor the schools that are leading the way to prepare students for success in college and careers," said Secretary Duncan. "National Blue Ribbon schools represent examples of educational excellence, and their work reflects the belief that every child in America deserves a world-class education."

The National Blue Ribbon Schools award honors public and private elementary, middle, and high schools where students perform at very high levels or where significant improvements are being made in students' levels of achievement.

The program recognizes schools in one of two performance categories. The first category is "Exemplary High Performing," in which schools are recognized among their state's highest performing schools, as measured by state assessments or nationally-normed tests. The second category is "Exemplary Improving," in which schools that have at least 40 percent of their students from disadvantaged backgrounds demonstrate the most progress in improving student achievement levels as measured by state assessments or nationally-normed tests.

To select National Blue Ribbon Schools, the Department requested nominations from the top education official in every state, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the Department of Defense Education Activity, and the Bureau of Indian Education. The Council for American Private Education (CAPE) nominates private schools. A total of 420 schools nationwide may be nominated, with allocations determined by the numbers of K-12 students and schools in each jurisdiction. The Secretary of Education invites nominated schools to submit an application for possible recognition as a National Blue Ribbon School.

Parent Portal Now Available For All Grades

The portal is the only place to see NYS Grade 3-8 Test Results

Dear Parent or Guardian:

The Cold Spring Harbor school district has extended access to our electronic parent portal to parents of all students.

What information will I have access to?

Different grade levels have access to different information.

Grades K through 3 - Report cards and attendance

Grades 4 through 6 – Report cards, attendance and results for prior year's New York State standardized tests in ELA and Math, as well as Science (last year's grade 4)

Grades 7 and 8 – Student schedules, attendance, progress reports, report cards, teacher grade books and results for prior year's New York State standardized tests in ELA and Math

Grades 9 through 12 - same as 7 and 8, and unofficial transcripts.

How can I apply for access to the portal?

Note that if you already have an account (because you have a student in the Jr/Sr High) there is no need to create another. You can see all your children's information from your existing account.

You can apply for an account online by visiting our website at www.csh.k12.ny.us and selecting Parent Portal on the left.

When applying online, you will need to have the following information handy:

- Parent/Guardian Name (apply using one parent's name only; you can create separate accounts for each parent if you like)
- Student Name
- Student ID Number (can be found on schedule/progress report/report card this is the same as your child's lunch ID number)
- Student Grade Level
- School

We hope you find this system helpful in staying informed of your child's progress.

- Once your account is approved, log in. You will see your students. Click on the student's name.

in April of this past school year, the Cold Spring Harbor School District administered the New York State English Language Arts and Math Assessment to all students in grades 3-8. In addition, students in grades 4 and 8 were administered a science assessment It is important to note that this year's scores cannot be compared to any previous year's performance, as these represent the first standardized assessments aligned with the new Common Core State Standards. In this regard, these scores serve as a baseline measurement for a new and more rigorous set of learning standards.

Students are assigned a performance level based on how they perform on the test. Although there are four possible performance levels, there is a broad range of points on a scale (Scale Score) associated with each performance level and within each grade. A score at performance level 3 or 4 is considered proficient, indicating that the student's performance demonstrates a thorough understanding of the knowledge and skills expected at that grade level and subject area assessed. Students who received a score at performance level 1 or 2 demonstrated partial understanding of the knowledge and skills expected at that grade level and subject area






