Remember that you can access the online portion of the *Envision Math* program for more information about the topics your child is studying. (www.pearsonsuccessnet.com) Your child's user name is: *First initial, last name, followed by your child's HS graduation year*. e.g. MSmith26. *The password is lowercase s followed by your child's student ID*, e.g. s12345. Once you log on, you will click on the word *Explore* in the top right corner. Then click on a topic your child is studying. Click on *View* to view the video introducing the topic and then *My Books* and the *Open Book* icon to see the student materials. There is even a Glossary with visual supports to help you define mathematical terms for your child.
