Dear Parents,

Whether you will be home or away on a trip next week, there are ways you can continue to build your child's vocabulary and background knowledge while enjoying family time together.

The planning of any trip is an opportunity for lessons in geography. If your family will be traveling, show your child the place on a map. Notice and name the state or country, point out other places in the region such as landmarks or landforms, and/or surrounding bodies of water. Use the Internet to find out a little bit about the history or culture of the place you're visiting. Just a few minutes of reading and discussion can go a long way in building your child's knowledge base about the world.

If you will be staying home next week, there are a number of fun and educational activities on Long Island to enjoy with your children. Here is a list, courtesy of Newsday:

- Enjoy a Spring Egg Hunt at the CSH Fish Hatchery on Saturday, April 4th at 2:30 p.m.
- The Vanderbilt Museum and Planetarium in Centerport has special art and science workshops for children in kindergarten through fourth grade. Activities include learning how ancient Egyptians measured time, making a working sundial, visiting the Marine Museum and learning about whales, fish, sea turtles and sharks. The events are from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. each day.
- Head out on a seal-watching expedition with the Riverhead Foundation on Saturday, April 4; Sunday, April 5; and Wednesday, April 8 through Sunday, April 12 aboard the Captain Lou Fleet (28A Woodcleft Ave., Freeport). - Kids can rock out with the Imagination Movers, stars of a Disney Junior TV Series for preschoolers at Landmark on Main Street in Port Washington on Friday, April 10 at 7 p.m. Rich, Scott, Dave and Smitty will lead the audience through interactive dances and more. - Be inspired by artist Willem de Kooning as you experiment with drawing the human figure at the Long Island Children's Museum in Garden City on Monday, April 6 through Friday, April 10 at 11 a.m., 1 and 3 p.m. Through collage and paint, kids can turn their drawings into a masterpiece. - At the Cold Spring Harbor Whaling Museum children ages 5-7 can join in to "rescue" stranded dolphins, learn about conservation, meet ocean creatures and make tons of fun recycled crafts to take home on Monday, April 6 through Friday, April 10 at 9:30 a.m. They can enjoy self-serve craft stations among the exhibits at from 2:30 to 5 p.m. each day.
- On Monday, April 6 and Tuesday, April 7 at 2 p.m., check out "The Joshua Show" at the Long Island Children's Museum. Puppeteer Joshua Holden brings audiences a heartwarming story about friendship, confidence and the value of being yourself. For more information, visit licm.org.

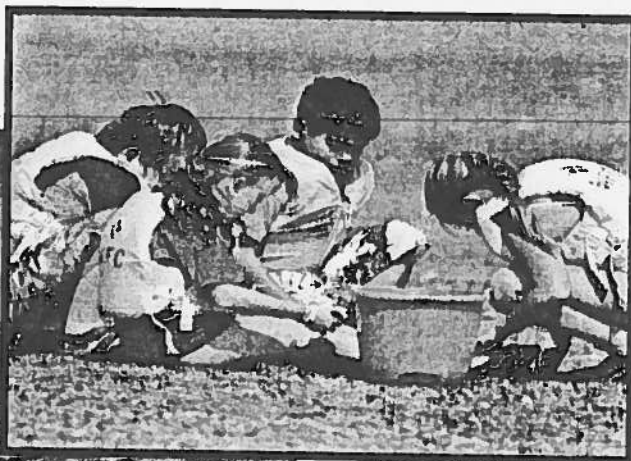

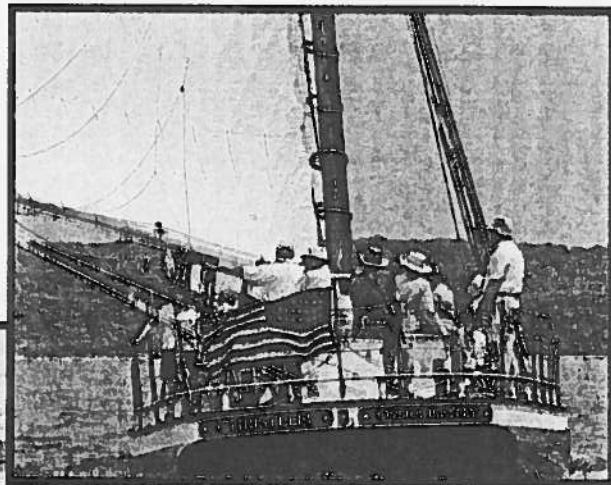

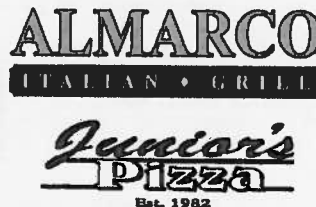
