

Goosehill Primary School Weekly Notes- October 3, 2014



Dear Parents,

Our social-emotional literacy (SEL) curriculum is based on the work of Dr. Mark Brackett of Yale University. The program is called "The Ruler Approach." Ruler is an acronym for the skills we teach children about managing emotions. We teach them to: <u>Recognize</u>, <u>Understand</u>, <u>Label</u>, <u>Express</u>, and <u>Regulate their emotions</u> so that they are able to build positive relationships, manage stress, and learn at high levels.

At the beginning of the school year, we focus on the first three "tools" of the Ruler Approach: the **Charter**, the **Mood Meter**, and the **Metamoment** strategy. As you know, **Classroom Charters** have been developed in all classrooms and a **School Charter** was developed with all of the students at a series of assemblies in September.

Here is the School Charter we developed together:

#### **Goosehill Primary School Charter 2014-15**

In our classrooms, in the lunchroom, on the playground and bus, and in our hallways, we want to feel... safe, happy, excited, included, comfortable, good, loved

 What will we do to make sure we all feel this way?
 Say nice words.
 Keep our bodies to ourselves

 Follow the rules.
 Invite people to play.
 Stick up for each other

 Help each other.
 Take Meta-Moments (kindergarten students are just beginning to learn about Metamoments)

What should we do if someone doesn't live by our charter? (If someone is mean, or hurts us with words or actions...) Tell them, "Follow our charter!" Ask them to stop. Don't do it back.

Give them an "I" message. ("I don't like it when you do that. It hurts my feelings.")

Tell an adult.

If someone doesn't learn and breaks the charter again... What should the adults do?

(What are the consequences for "hurtful choices"?)

Give the student a break. Tell the teacher/principal. Call parents. Miss something fun, like recess. Make a promise to follow the charter.

As you can see, our students are very capable of expressing their needs and establishing guidelines for conduct! They were honest and open during our discussions and seemed to possess a real sense of what is right and fair. It was interesting to note that every group of students felt strongly that parents should be called if a child "breaks" the charter more than once. While they respect the authority of their teachers and principal, they intuitively know that their parents must be involved if their behavior is to change. I have shared the Charter with you so that you can use some of the same language with your child. A consistent approach benefits children.

The most important idea we share with the children is that our job is to teach them to be the very best people they can be. They may make mistakes along the way, but we will support and guide them so that they don't make the same mistakes twice. Also, it is the job of adults to ensure that all children are safe, comfortable, and happy at school, but children have a voice and can stand up for themselves and for each other.

At Goosehill, we are committed to helping children learn to manage their emotions and build positive relationships. We appreciate being able to work in partnership with parents to ensure that all children are safe, happy, and comfortable at school. Please don't hesitate to call your child's teacher or me if you have a concern to share. Your insights will help us address potential problems more quickly and efficiently.

- ✓ We prefer that children not come to school with their hair spray-painted




- 2. If the door is blocked by smoke or fire, leave through a window or secondary emergency route.
- 3. Once out of the house go directly to your meeting place, such as a tree or mailbox on your front lawn.

1. Feel the door to check if it's HOT! If it's Not Hot open the door slowly, bracing it with your knees and shoulder. But be prepared to slam it shut quickly if there's smoke and fire on the other side.

#### SMOKE DETECTORS

Most fatal residential fires occur while the occupants are asleep. Installing smoke detectors outside bedroom areas will provide the extra minutes of warning needed to escape. The most recent figures available from the National Fire Incident Reporting System indicates that the installation of a Smoke Detector will double your chance of survival during a fire.

#### **DEVELOPING THE PLAN**


Members of the family should work together to draw a plan of each floor of your house where bedrooms are located.

Your plan should include:

- The location of Smoke Detectors.
- Two escape routes; one for normal and one for Emergency use.
- All doors, windows, stairways, fire escapes and adjacent buildings.
- A central meeting place outside your home.

If a window is designated as an Emergency Route, make sure the person who uses it is able to reach and unlock the window, remove the screen and / or the storm window, reach the ground safely.

Designate someone to call the fire department from a neighbor's house. Post a copy of your finished plan in a conspicuous place as a constant reminder.



#### PRACTICE YOUR PLAN ON A MONTHLY BASIS AND REMEMBER THESE IMPORTANT HINTS:

- Sleeping with bedroom doors closed can add valuable minutes of protection against flame, smoke and toxic gases.
- If you have a telephone in your room, have the Fire Department's number on it or nearby.
- Keeping a whistle, horn, or other such audible signal near your bed may prove valuable in waking other members of your family who may not hear the smoke detector. If family members use a different signal you will know who is awake without opening doors.

#### MAKE OPERATION E.D.I.T.H. A MEMBER OF YOUR FAMILY!

#### PUTTING THE PLAN INTO ACTION

If the smoke detector sounds or you smell smoke, wake your family with your signal. If you hear another signal answer with yours. Keep Calm. Roll out of bed and crawl to the door. Feel the door from bottom to top. If it is hot near the top do not open it. Proceed to your designated emergency exit.


If the top of the door is not hot, brace your foot and shoulder against it and open it carefully. If there is only light smoke, crawl to the normal exit. If the smoke is dense or the door is hot use the Emergency Exit. Report to the designated meeting place.

Notify the Fire Department from a neighbor's house. DO NOT ALLOW ANYONE TO RE-ENTER THE BUILDING FOR ANY REASON.




