Dear Parents,

I would like to provide you with information on a few important topics this week:

Reading Workshop for Parents

At the parent workshop on Wednesday, we discussed a number of important ideas: how reading skills develop, how teachers assess young readers, and how parents can support their children's developing skills. During the first part of the workshop, I shared our expectations of readers at different points in the year in kindergarten and first grade and how we provide support for students who need a boost in their development. Parents found the information helpful, especially because it is the time of year when they are meeting with teachers to discuss their children's strengths and needs. The second part of our discussion focused on how parents can support their children's reading comprehension skills by reading aloud to them. Because parents found the information to be so helpful, I will be presenting the workshop again on Thursday, November 20th at 9:30. I hope you'll be able to attend!

School Improvement Team (SIT)

SIT is a committee made up of parents, teachers, teacher assistants, and the principal. We meet monthly to work on projects designed to enhance the school experience for our students. Each year, the SIT establishes goals and develops a plan to address them. This year's goals and ways you can contribute to the work of the team are:

- 1) To begin to create an electronic Parent Handbook (accessible on the School Website) outlining school procedures and providing parents with tips and useful information. You will receive an email from the GPFA requesting that you submit your ideas for inclusion in the handbook. Thank you in advance for taking the time to contribute your ideas!
- 2) To plan and implement a school-wide Healthy Living event for students on Friday, January 16, 2015 (half day for students). Each class will rotate through nine workshops (12 minutes each) offered by teachers and parent volunteers. We will be seeking parents who would like to offer workshops on topics such as (but not limited to): how the body works, healthy eating, yoga, exercise, staying safe, stress management. You will receive a flyer next month inviting your ideas and participation.

Safety Drills

As you know, we conduct safety drills on a regular basis. The children learn what to do in the event of emergencies requiring either evacuation or a lockdown of the building. Today we conducted the first lockdown drill. Teachers instructed the children to be seated in a specified area of the classroom. They explained that Lockdown means we lock the door and sit down in a safe area in our classrooms. The drill serves as a practice experience for the children so that in the event of an emergency, they will be more readily able to follow their teacher's directions. Most importantly, it serves as an opportunity for the adults in charge to review and implement our safety protocols. During the remaining months of the school year, we will conduct additional drills as a matter of course and without notification. Please be assured that we make every effort to ensure that the children are not alarmed. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me.

Thank you for taking the time to read these Weekly Notes. I hope they serve to keep you informed about your child's school experience.




