Dear Parents,

An important component of the New York State Social Studies framework for kindergarten and first grade involves teaching children about diversity. Here are a few concepts from the curriculum:

- > Children, families, and communities exhibit cultural similarities and differences.
- > Language, beliefs, customs, and traditions help shape the identity and culture of a family and a community.
- > Diverse cultural groups embrace unique traditions and beliefs, and celebrate distinct holidays.
- > Awareness of America's rich diversity fosters intercultural understanding.

When teaching children about diversity, we emphasize that all people are the same on the "inside" and have many, wonderful differences on the "outside." We celebrate and respect people's differences in the way they look, dress, speak, and celebrate holidays. Because many of our families celebrate a holiday in December, the children are very interested in the topic. In many classrooms, children are choosing to write about their family traditions and holidays and teachers provide opportunities for them to share their stories with each other.

Reading books together is a perfect way to start a conversation about the traditions of families that may be different from your own. Of course, there are many, many wonderful books to be found in the library and book stores. Try series such as My First Holiday series by Karen Katz and Rookie Read About Holidays to help you explore holidays and traditions around the world.

#### Integrating Science and Art---Snowflakes Appearing at the Cold Spring Harbor Whaling Museum

**First graders** created crystallized snowflakes which will be displayed at the Whaling Museum this month. During **art** class they shaped pipe cleaners to form snowflake shapes. In **science**, they watched a video about how snowflakes form and learned that every snowflake is unique. They measured 6 tablespoons of Borax (laundry detergent booster) and poured it into individual mason jars. Ms. Stapleton, our science teacher aide, poured two cups of boiling water to each jar and stirred until everything dissolved. The pipe cleaner snowflake shapes were then suspended in the mixture overnight. As the water cooled, the crystals formed on the pipe cleaners and by morning we had crystallized snowflakes! **Please visit the Whaling Museum's Winter Wonderland any Saturday in December (1-4 p.m.)** While you're there, you can enjoy making crafts (for all ages) and participate in a special winter-themed scavenger hunt.

- 4. The eSchoolData login screen will open. Click on "Online Registration" (bottom of the box).
- 5. You will be asked to fill out information on three tabs, beginning with the Account Information portion (followed by Personal Information and Student Information).
- 6. Once all parts have been filled out you will receive an automatically-generated email indicating that your registration information has been submitted.
