





SkillsTutor Available to Students Summer 2015

The Cold Spring Harbor Central School District is pleased to again offer the use of *SkillsTutor*[®] to our current kindergarten through 6th grade students this summer.

The District's license to *SkillsTutor*® provides the opportunity for your child to develop individualized proficiency in Math Fact Fluency. Although there are other modules, this summer our focus is on math practice.

You will find there are many other resources in your school summer packet – but we do strongly encourage you to have your student utilize SkillsTutor this summer as well.

Your child's current classroom teacher has assigned appropriate activities for your child. These can be accessed by visiting the website: www.myskillstutor.com and entering the information provided by your child's teacher. This includes a user name, password, and the site name which is **lloyd02**

The goal of offering access to SkillsTutor is to provide continuous practice in Math Facts Fluency, an expectation for the next grade. Practice throughout the summer will provide a strong foundation as your child continues math instruction next year.

How often should my child work with Skills Tutor?

We recommend a minimum of one hour a week or ten minutes a day.
