President's Report...

BOE President Robert C. Hughe's report included the following:

Good evening and welcome back to another year of learning. We will be hearing shortly from our school principals about the opening of schools this year. Spoiler alert: I think everything went smoothly. In two weeks, on September 29, the Board will have a workshop to discuss setting goals for the coming year. In the coming months, we will also discuss the new procedures for formulating and distributing class schedules at the High School and the flow of traffic at the High School during drop off and pick up. The Board discussed the traffic flow issue in 2009 and 2011. With the passage of time, it seems appropriate to revisit the issue.

But those discussions await future Board meetings. Tonight we want to recognize the designation of two of our schools as Reward Schools by the State of New York. This designation is made every year. The State selects those schools that demonstrate high performance on the State assessments as well as closing achievement gaps among subgroups. We traditionally have at least one school designated each year. This year, based on the results from the 2013-14 school year, we have two. Those schools are West Side and the High School. Congratulations.
