Weekly Notes-September 18, 2015



Dear Parents,

At Goosehill Primary School, we are committed to the education of the "whole child." We know it is just as important to help children learn to manage their emotions and build positive relationships as it is to teach them to read and write. Recent research findings have added to a growing body of evidence which suggests that if we want children to lead fulfilling and productive lives, we have to help them develop social and emotional strengths like self-regulation, self-awareness and social awareness — strengths that are necessary for them to fully benefit from their education and succeed in many other areas of life.

Our school district adopted a social-emotional literacy (SEL) curriculum based on the work of Dr. Mark Brackett of Yale University. The program is called "The Ruler Approach." Ruler is an acronym for the skills we teach children about managing emotions. We teach them to: Recognize, Understand, Label, Express, and Regulate their emotions so that they are able to manage stress, interact respectfully, solve problems, and learn at high levels.

The first component of our SEL program is a **charter**. A charter is similar to a set of guidelines, or rules, but its focus is on fostering a sense of community. **Classroom Charters** are being developed in all classrooms and a **School Charter** has been developed with the input of all of the students. During grade level assemblies, the students responded to the following questions: "How do we want to feel in school? What should we do to make sure we all feel that way?" and "What can we do if someone breaks our charter?" Their answers to these important questions helped develop a document that will serve as an anchor in our discussions about appropriate behavior, making helpful choices, and treating others with kindness. During our first grade assembly, Daniel, from Mrs. Katz's class, offered a "Golden Rule" for Goosehill: "Be nice to EVERYONE in the WHOLE school!" A poster of our new "golden rule' is now prominently displayed in our hallway.

The most important idea we share with the children is that our job is to teach them to be the very best people they can be. They may make mistakes along the way, but we will support and guide them so that they don't make the same mistake twice. Also, we teach them that it is the job of adults to ensure that all children are safe, comfortable, and happy at school, but children have a voice and can stand up for themselves and for each other.

We appreciate being able to work in partnership with parents to ensure that the school experience for all of our students is the very best it can be. Please don't hesitate to call your child's teacher or me if you have a concern to share. Your insights will help us address potential problems quickly and efficiently.

If Your Child Isn't Feeling Well

Sometimes it is hard to know when to keep your child home from school. First, consider whether or not your child seems comfortable and well enough to participate in school activities all day. Certainly, a child should stay home from school if s/he is running a fever of 100° or greater. S/he may return to school once there is no fever for over 24 hours without fever-reducing medication. Children who have no appetite and complain of stomach pain, are clingy or lethargic, or who are using the bathroom more frequently should stay home to rest and recover. If your child has a cough or runny nose that is producing excessive mucus or discolored discharge, it is important to keep him/her home and consult with a doctor.

Although we teach children ways to prevent the spread of germs, your support in promoting healthy habits are very much appreciated.

Procedures for informing the school about your child's absence: If your child will be absent from school, please call the HEALTH OFFICE in the morning before 9:00 a.m. (631-367-5950). If you call before school hours, simply leave a voicemail indicating the reason your child is absent. Please do not email or call the Main Office to report your child's absence. Upon your child's return to school, please send a note explaining the absence. (This is required by the NYS Education Department.) Please don't worry about missing assignments if your child is absent one or two days due to illness.

Reminders:

✓ Please remember to send your child to school wearing **sneakers** on days when s/he has physical education class. It is important that children wear **closed footwear** every day so that they can run and play safely on the playground.



✓ Please use the **yellow change of transportation form** if it is necessary to change your child's dismissal plan. Notes must be sent to school in the morning with your child.




