First Grade Turtle Program- Our first graders have begun their study of turtles. In collaboration with the Cold Spring Harbor Fish Hatchery and Aquarium, our students raise baby turtles and release them back into the "wild" in June. This week our students learned about the tanks and equipment the turtles need, how to care for them, and about the features of turtles and other members of the reptile family. The teachers engage the children throughout the year in investigations related to the turtle's habitat, life cycle, and adaptations. Each class names their turtle and assumes responsibility for caring for him/her every day.

- Develops a sense of rhythm




