Principal's Corner

This week our second graders continued to draft their realistic fiction pieces and focused on the problems in their stories. Throughout the week they edited, erased, and contemplated different ways to bring their characters to life. Third graders published their small moments and are prepared for their next writing unit which will shift to nonfiction. Students will become the experts and write about topics they choose. Fourth graders published their realistic fiction pieces in the computer lab. They also worked in small groups as they reviewed different strategies for solving two-digit by two-digit multiplication problems. Fifth graders analyzed text to make stronger meaning of new words, learned about different joints of the human body, and used bar modeling as a technique to problem solve during math. Finally, sixth graders collaborated with their peers during reading. Students participated in social issues book clubs and participated in meaningful discussions. These books, such as Crash and Bystander, served as excellent springboards for these conversations with their peers.
