### Board President, Amelia Brogan, shared:

As we accept Mr. Jay Matuk's retirement at the end of this school year, I would like to acknowledge his valuable contributions to the Cold Spring Harbor School District as high school principal over the past 11 years.

Mr. Matuk came to Cold Spring Harbor as a seasoned administrator and educational leader who has worked in the field of education for over 30 years. After more than ten years in the classroom as a Social Studies teacher, Mr. Matuk began his building leadership experience. Prior to coming to Cold Spring Harbor, he served as an Assistant Principal at both Long Beach and Shoreham-Wading River High Schools before serving as Principal at Western Suffolk BOCES, Walt Whitman Alternative High School, Connetquot High School and Patchogue-Medford High School. Mr. Matuk continues to be a hands-on educator, contributing his skill set to programs at Queens College, College of St. Rose and Long Island University.

In his role as building leader, Mr. Matuk has worked to improve student life and learning activities. Under Mr. Matuk's guidance, the education of the students has remained paramount and new initiatives have been successfully initiated. As principal, Mr. Matuk assisted in reviving business elective courses, expanding opportunities for the performing and fine arts, as well as introduced many new clubs, including Robotics. In addition, Mr. Matuk supported programs such as Rachel's Challenge and Natural Helpers to improve the quality of student life. He also has been "vigilant" in addressing issues related to safety and security. Under his leadership, he instituted a mandatory meeting for campus drivers highlighting safety issues for both students and parents when behind the wheel, and was instrumental in implementing programs addressing substance abuse prevention.

The leadership Mr. Matuk has provided our district has supported students, parents, and teachers. Although we whole heartedly wish him well as he starts this new chapter in his life, we will miss the guidance and support he has provided our district.
