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SUMMER READING

First graders received information about summer reading from their next schools. Today, all children met with the Cold Spring Harbor Librarian., Mrs. Kornstein, to learn about the public library's summer reading program.

Kindergarten students will have a special opportunity to share their summer reading with their peers electronically this summer. Using an app called Flipgrid, students will be able to view short videos of their peers giving reviews of books they've read and enjoyed! Then they can record themselves sharing their own book for others to view. In this way, we hope to encourage students to read more and share their love of books with each other this summer. Instructions will be sent home next week and the link will be posted on the Goosehill website. All you need is a device on which you can download the free app and record your child. (e.g. phone, iPad, laptop) If you do not have the proper equipment, simply email Mrs. Herschlein over the summer and she will arrange for you to do the recording at school. (First graders are invited to view the videos too!)


