Dear Parents:

In the coming weeks, we will begin forming classes for the 2017-18 school year. Our goal is to create well-balanced, heterogeneous classes where all children can thrive socially and academically. Classroom and special area teachers, support service providers, and the principal are all involved in the process. We work carefully to group students so that each class is balanced in terms of gender, social development, work habits, and academic performance.

Parental input is appropriate if your child has <u>specific needs that are not already known to us</u>. If this is the case, you may submit a letter to the principal's attention by **April 21st**. Because the grouping process will begin at that time, letters received after April 21st cannot be considered.

We will give the same level of care and attention to the placement of every child whether a letter is written or not. However, if you choose to submit a letter, please note:

- <u>Letters should be addressed to the principal and sent to the Main Office</u>. (not via email) **Requests should never be made to a teacher.**
- If you are writing with regard to more than one child, **separate letters** must be submitted.
- <u>Requests for placement with a specific child cannot be accepted</u>. Our goal is to help students build friendships with many different children over the course of their educational experience.
- <u>Requests for *separation from* one specific child may be considered</u>. We cannot accept a request to separate your child from **more than one child**.
- **<u>Requests for a specific teacher will not be considered</u></u>. In fairness to all, letters of this nature will be returned.**
- If you would like to request that your child not be assigned a particular teacher, it must be due to the prior experience of a sibling. Please include the name and year the sibling was in the class. This is the only request with regard to a specific teacher that will be accepted.
- For students entering second grade, the placement process is completed by the Goosehill team.
- Letters from past years are not saved, and therefore cannot be considered.

Because of the complex nature of the process, once class assignments are made in August, placements are final.

We appreciate your confidence in the professional staff as we begin this important process. Thank you for your continued support of our efforts to create an educational environment where every child will be happy and successful.

As you know, during the months of March and April, students in grades **three** through **six** will be taking NYS Assessments in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Fourth graders will also be taking a NYS Science Test. The specific dates of these exams are listed below.

ELA: March 28, 29, 30 (Tuesday – Thursday)
Math: May 2, 3, 4 (Tuesday – Thursday)
Science (grade 4): Monday, June 5

(Note: the performance portion of the exam will be given the week prior)

Parents can help to prepare their children for success by:

- ensuring they get a good night's sleep before each day of testing
- providing them with a balanced breakfast on the morning of the exam
- encouraging them to simply try their best when taking the tests

Please make sure that your child is not late to school on testing days. EXAMS BEGIN PROMPTLY AT 9:00 am.

To be Eligible:

- The show is open to all Westside students in grades 2-6.
- A \$35 Fee MUST be submitted with your application. This fee includes the cost of the 2017 West Side Talent Show T-shirt and CD. **NO APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT PAYMENT AND A** <u>*T-SHIRT SIZE*</u>.
- Applications are due by <u>3/31/17</u>. Late submissions will not be accepted. All students must return a completed and signed Talent Show Participation Form with check and T-shirt size.
- Soloists and groups of any size are eligible.
- This year, students will have the opportunity to perform in <u>one solo act and one group act</u>, with the exception of sixth graders, who will have the opportunity, in addition, to perform a big group number at the end of the show if they choose. A sixth grade parent is encouraged to volunteer as coordinator for this act. Please contact Kerri Albers at <u>kerrialbers@optonline.net</u> if you are interested.
- All music, whether it's for a dance, song or background music, is due by <u>3/31/17</u>. The CD should be labeled with the student's name(s), song name, and artist/composer.

Planning your act:

- Lyrics, costumes and performances should be compliant with school policy and appropriate for all audiences. Clean versions of songs only.
- All acts will be limited to 2 minutes.
- <u>Submit your application and music early as we are limiting the same song to be performed only</u> <u>twice during the show. Any soloist or group who submits their application with a same song</u> <u>already approved to two other groups will have to choose a new song for their act.</u>
- Most of all be creative and show off your true talent! Unique acts are always appreciated!!

Rehearsals:

- The show will be broken up into two Acts with an intermission in between.
- <u>You must attend two rehearsals plus the dress rehearsal</u>. All performers are required to be at the first rehearsal on Wednesday April 19 from 3:15-5. (Once your act is done, you may go home) Your act does not need to be polished at this 1st rehearsal, this is more for placement in the show. For the 2nd rehearsal, all acts MUST be complete and ready to be performed. You will be assigned the 2nd rehearsal based on which act you are in, either Wed. May 3 for Act 1 or Thurs. May 4 for Act 2 at Westside School from 3:15-5:00 (Once your act is done, you may go home). There will be a dress/tech rehearsal on Thursday May 11 at the Cold Spring Harbor High School Performance Arts Center (PAC) right after school for all performers. All

performers must stay for the entire time as we will be rehearsing the finale as well. You must be at your scheduled rehearsal to perform in the show. This is mandatory. *If you are unable to commit to these rehearsals, please do not sign up to be in the talent show.*

- Parents must send a note to the child's teacher when their child is scheduled to stay after school for rehearsal. If your child does not have a note, the teacher will have to send your child home in the usual way.
- All students must sign in with a Talent Show committee member upon arrival, and sign out when leaving the rehearsal.

Courtesy and Conduct:

- Those students who would like to volunteer for backstage crew or other jobs for the night of the show should contact Kerri Albers at kerrialbers@optonline.net
- Please take your time in deciding your act. This is a full commitment for you and your fellow group members. We would like to avoid any unnecessary tears so please make this a binding agreement with those you sign up with.
- Once a group has been formed and paperwork submitted, there will be <u>absolutely no</u> <u>switching from group to group</u> with only one exception as followed. If a person does drop out for any reason, the person left in the group may continue to perform solo or may find another student who has not signed up for any act to take their place. If that person cannot find another person to join them, at that point they may join an existing group if the group has approved it.
- If a student drops out of an act. That student will <u>not</u> be permitted to participate in any other acts for the 2017 talent show.
- Students can submit their applications via backpack, labeled "West Side Talent Show"
