Principal's Corner

This was a special week. On Tuesday our students experienced something for the very first time. Our new Superintendent, Mr. Fenter, spent the entire day at West Side. The day began as Mr. Fenter spoke to all of our students and faculty members in the gym during morning assembly. He was introduced by Student Council President, CJ Reilly. Ms. Ryan's second graders worked with reading buddies while Ms. Santoro's class found ways to break numbers down in order to assist with addition. Needless to say, Mr. Fenter was impressed by our youngest students. In third grade, Dr. Dawkins' students interviewed Mr. Fenter, and Mr. Farmer's learners showed him the value of their morning routine which sets the tone for each day. In fourth grade, some of our students had the opportunity to show Mr. Fenter how to make slime in the science lab with Ms. Baratta. Finally, sixth graders in Ms. Gerver's class welcomed Mr. Fenter to a friendly game of fraction basketball. Thank you to all of our sixth grade ambassadors who met Mr. Fenter at each room and to James Tucker and Bryce Kipnes who, once prepped by Ms. Agnello, gave Mr. Fenter a tour of West Side's history.
