Objective:

This course offers students the opportunity to create a website using Adobe Dreamweaver. Students will learn how to save images properly for the web, use web-safe colors in their design elements and begin to use Dreamweaver to create and save HTML pages. Weekly demonstrations and student projects will be the focus of the course.

Supply List:

A flash (thumb) drive for transporting, storing, and backing up work.

Access to a Digital Camera for HW assignments.

There will be a photography assignment every week. (Please DO NOT bring your camera to school- only the camera memory card with your homework photos. We cannot guarantee the security of your camera.)

These guidelines are designed for your benefit- they insure that your class time is spent learning new ways to create, and that the tools you need remain available to you and everyone else. Our classroom will be a creative, sharing and cooperative community!

Equipment guidelines:

1. During class, computers are for Web Design class assignments only.

No games, surfing, checking e-mails, social sites, or outside work. No YOU TUBE unless specifically directed by the teacher. (Alternative written assignments are available for every lesson.)

No changing preferences, or desktop images. These are communal machines.

The above are meant to make sure your personal artistic time is not reduced or stalled by distractions or interruptions.

2. Any portable equipment must be checked out with the teacher, and returned promptly on the expected date.

Video cameras and other equipment that you check out are your responsibility.

The student must promptly replace borrowed equipment that is lost or broken while in their possession or use. This insures that your fellow classmates are also able to do their assignments, and the class can move forward. Our supplies are limited. (Please see the back of this sheet for prices of the items that will be available.)

3. Flash drives, camera cards, and any other personal equipment you bring to class must leave the classroom with you everyday.

Please do not assume anything left behind will be found. (Exception: headphones. I will store those.)
