Content

Global History and Geography is a two-year course. The first year of the course examines world history prior to 1770. Beginning with the birth of civilization and continuing with a cross-cultural, chronological journey through the ages, Global History and Geography I challenges students to rediscover life before the advent of the Industrial Revolution. It is a window into the World's past, a state-mandated course culminating in a Regents examination. Global History and Geography II examines the modern world from the Age of Revolutions to the present-day.

Regents

The Global History and Geography Regents Examination is a standardized assessment given to students enrolled in New York State schools, in June, August, and January. Generally given at the end of tenth grade, this test is the culmination of two years of study in global history and geography. The test consists of 50 multiple-choice questions, one thematic essay, and one document-based question (DBQ). Part A of the DBQ contains several short answer questions based on specific documents. Part B of the DBQ consists of an essay that requires students to analyze the documents from Part A.
