### Overview

Welcome to Advanced Placement World History I. This is a college level course, and it will be an intense year. This year, we will be studying the early history of Europe, Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the Middle East. Please note that this class is the first part of a two-year sequence. The course ultimately concludes with an AP exam and a Regents exam at the end of 10<sup>th</sup> grade. If we all do our part, we can look forward to a successful and enjoyable year.

# **Methods**

You will be assigned pages to read in your textbook or other articles a few times a week. Most readings will be accompanied with questions for you to complete. You will complete chapter outlines. Homework will be collected.

The only way to genuinely enjoy Global History is by doing. Therefore, you will be assigned several small projects each semester. Essays will be assigned as well. Points will be deducted for anything handed in late.

### **Classroom Conduct**

The following guidelines are meant to help the group develop a proper environment for the discussion of values and decision-making. - **3.** <u>Avoid Put-Downs</u>: Verbal put-downs hurt people, even when they appear not to be bothered. Non-verbal put-downs also hurt; these include facial expressions, gestures, side conversations, etc.
- **4.** Responsibility For Your Own Learning: Each person will learn as much or as little as he/she chooses to learn. Be responsible and work hard.
- 5. Be On Time: Students are expected to be in their seat with their homework in the "in-box" when the second bell rings. IF YOU ARE NOT IN YOUR SEAT WHEN THE BELL RINGS, YOU ARE LATE!!!
- **6.** <u>Use Of Facilities</u>: Students may use the facilities at the **beginning** of the period only if it is an emergency and only after the homework has been submitted. In addition, MP3, cell phones, and food are prohibited in the classroom.
