
- 1. 10-pages (5-"spreads") fully composed in the given Moleskine sketchbook
- 2. Minimum of 25-photographs (Range of subject matter required) Please print a sheet of thumbnails to hand in on the first day of school.
- 3. Entire book (gallery guide given by Mrs. Oswald) deconstructed and reworked in an intelligent and thoughtful manner.

In order to succeed in this course, you must bring a good, hardworking attitude entangled with motivation, energy, and commitment!

- You are going to need supplies to work throughout the summer, as well as all next year. Your Supply list (including a binder) can be found on the supply sheet must haves. These are to be used by YOU ONLY! You may store whatever you are using in the in the room beginning in September.
- It will be extremely helpful to begin an account on www.apcentral.collegeboard.com
 Note: You will need to know how many sections there are to an AP portfolio, what they are called, what the elements of art are, as well as the principles of design. If you have any extra time over the summer, research examples of the portfolio you are interested in. For example, once you've created your account, you can type in "AP 2D Design Breadth Examples" or "AP 2D Design Concentration Examples"
- If asked, are you able to answer the question, "Who is your favorite artist and why?" It is extremely important that you begin to identify what you like about respective artists and their work. It will help to train your eye, and identify your intentions in order to make your work the best that it can be.
