Welcome to the FIRST Tech Challenge. FTC is designed for CSH students in grades 7-8 to compete head to head, using a sports model. Teams are responsible for designing, building, and programming their robots to compete in an alliance format against other teams. The robot kit is reusable from year-to-year and is programmed using a variety of languages. Teams, including coaches, mentors and volunteers, are required to develop strategy and build robots based on sound engineering principles. Awards are given for the competition as well as for community outreach, design, and other real-world accomplishments. *Students get to:* Design, build, and program robots; Apply real-world math and science concepts; Develop problem-solving, organizational, and team-building skills; Compete and cooperate in alliances and tournaments; Compete for a spot in the World Championship; Qualify for over \$13.5 million in college scholarships. **Junior High Tech Challenge meets in the Robotic Room SC3 (Across from Math Computer Lab in S Wing).**

Date/Time-TBA **Season:** All Year

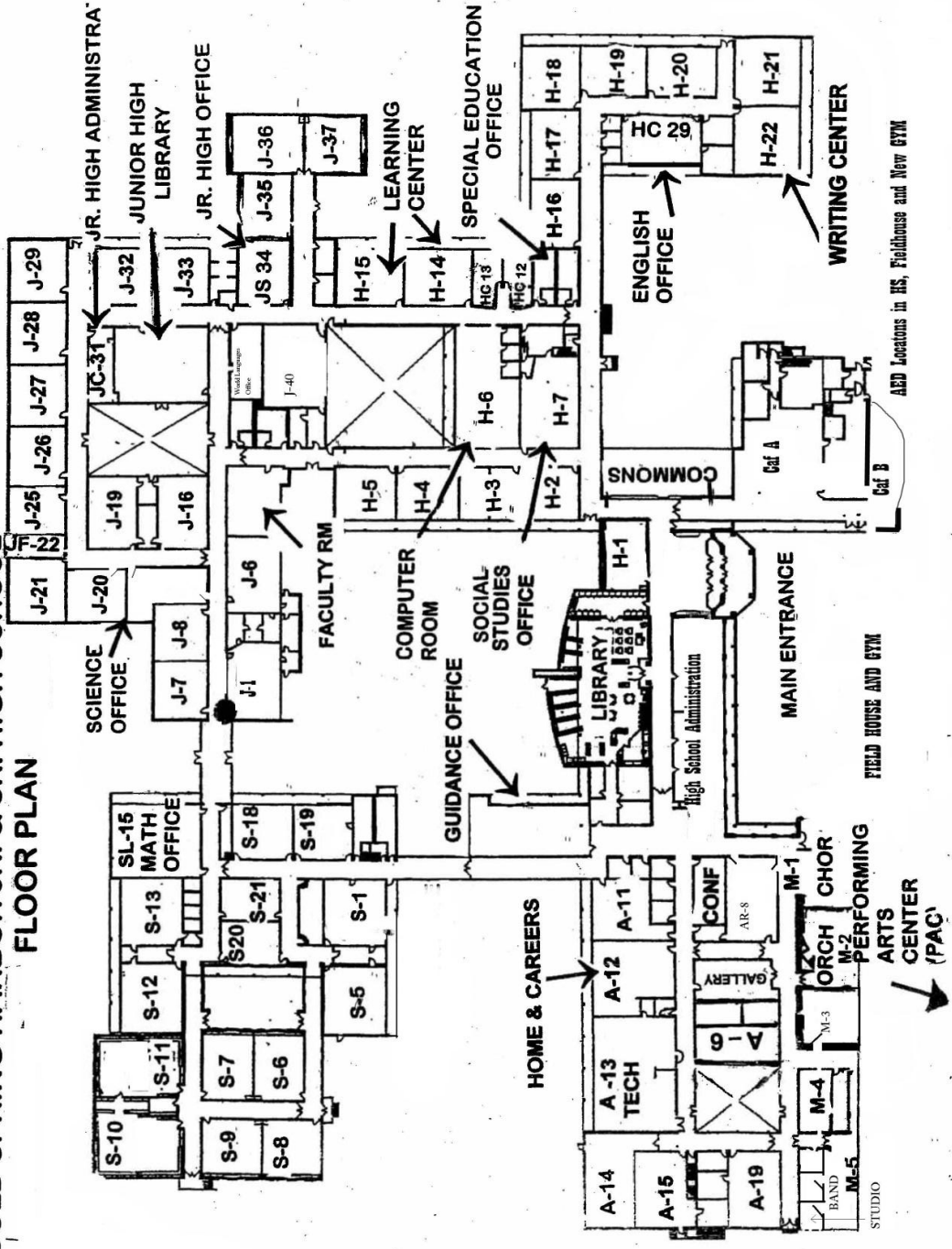
