SEAHAWKS BOOSTER CLUB

The Seahawks Booster Club is pleased to announce that we are raising funds to build a walkway from the high school parking area to Seahawk Field. This will allow fans and athletes alike to walk comfortably and safely from the high school parking area to the lower turf field - eliminating the need to walk along the roadway or on the existing dirt path.

The new walkway will be approximately nine feet wide, with a center asphalt walking surface bordered by inlaid bricks. To assist us in funding this effort, we are offering the opportunity to the Seahawk community to engrave these bricks to commemorate their support of Cold Spring Harbor High School, its students, faculty and athletic programs.

This is a family and community effort. We want to include as many students, families, friends, neighbors and local businesses as possible. Please consider purchasing a brick in honor of a new graduate, a favorite teacher or alumni, a special event, or in your family name. Our first phase is expected to be installed over the summer, so the first bricks must be purchased by June 15th!

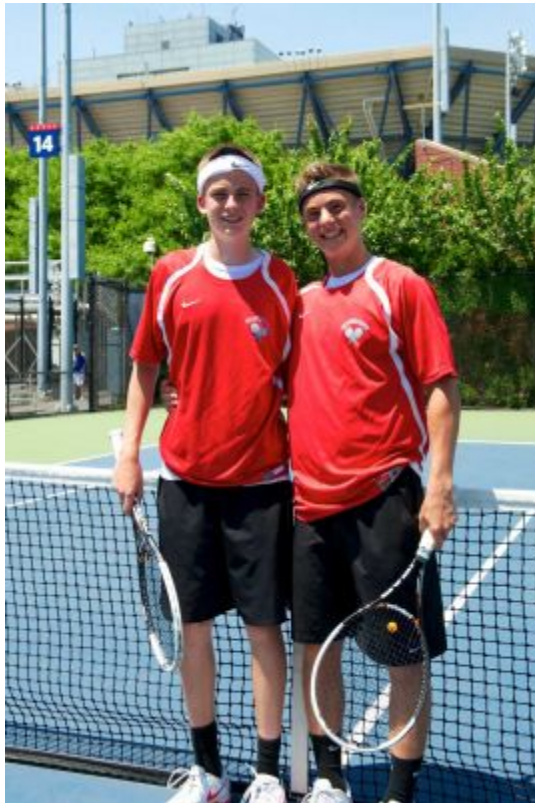

At the states...Isabelle bettered her own school record with a 4:43.57 for 5th place in NYS Class B...and Kelsey jumped 9' for 8th place in NYS Class B.
