**Attention Parents:** To be eligible for kindergarten in September 2012, <u>your child must be 5 years of age on or before December 1, 2012</u>. Your child is **NOT AUTOMATICALLY** enrolled as a kindergartner. Even if you currently have children attending Cold Spring Harbor Schools, <u>you must still register your incoming</u> **kindergarten child.** 

**Timeline:** As soon as possible, please contact the district registrar, Gloria Albert, to ensure that your child's name appears on the district census. (631) 367-5910 <u>In January</u>, you will receive a letter from the Superintendent of Schools, Dr. J. Wilansky, explaining the procedure and listing the documents required for registration. <u>Once you receive the letter</u>, please call Gloria Albert to make an appointment to register your child. **You MUST have an appointment to register your child for kindergarten**! Registration dates: **February 6-10, 2012.** <u>In March 2012</u>, a welcome letter containing important information about Kindergarten Screening and Orientation will be mailed to you from Goosehill Primary School.
