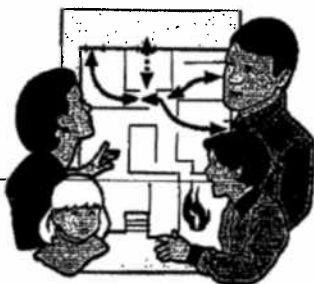
1. Feel the door to check if it's HOT!

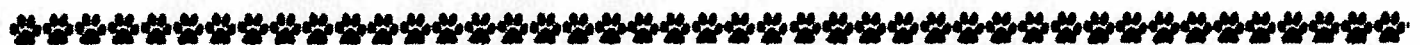
