KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

To be eligible for kindergarten in September 2014, your child must be 5 years of age on or before December 1, 2014. Your child is **NOT AUTOMATICALLY** enrolled as a kindergartner. Even if you currently have children

attending Cold Spring Harbor Schools, **you must still register your incoming kindergarten child.**

Timeline: As soon as possible, please contact the district registrar, Gloria Albert, to ensure that your child's name appears on the district census. Please call (631) 367-5910. You should have received a letter from the Superintendent of Schools, Dr. J. Wilansky, explaining the procedure and listing the documents required for registration. Please call Gloria Albert to make an appointment to register your child. **You must have an appointment to register your child for kindergarten.** Registration dates: **February 3-7, 2014.** In March, 2014, a welcome letter containing important information about Kindergarten Screening and Orientation will be mailed to you from Goosehill Primary School.

ABSENCES

Your child's absence is being recorded as an unknown and unexcused absence if you do not make a telephone call to the nurse's office. An absence note is not sufficient. The phone call must be made.

DRIVING CAUTION

When driving on the school grounds, please be mindful of our traffic patterns and be sure to proceed with caution.

MORNING ACTIVITIES DROP-OFFS

Only those children who have a scheduled morning activity may be dropped off before the 8:30AM start of school. We do not have the personnel to monitor students left here before this time.

For safety reasons, we ask that all children being picked up in the back circle wait in line until picked up. Children are not allowed to cross over the parking lot.

AFTERNOON ACTIVITIES - DISMISSAL

All students attending an after-school activity will be picked up at the back circle. Please follow the traffic pattern of the PM dismissal (reverse traffic flow). As always, the safety of our children is paramount. Children are not permitted to cross between cars or through the parking lots.

Please note there will be no access into the school after 4:15pm unless it has been previously arranged.

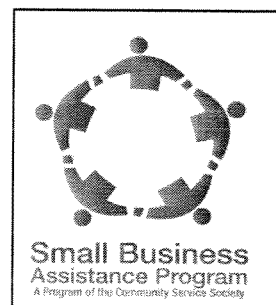
