BOARD OF EDUCATION

The next regular Board of Education meeting will be held on **Tuesday, April 8th** at 8pm at the DO.

OUTDOOR CLOTHING

As the weather gets warmer, we will be going outside again for recess. Please be sure your children are wearing the appropriate **outdoor** clothing.

EARLY PICK-UP

If you decide, after your child has left for school, that you need to pick him/her up early, it is not necessary to call ahead. Please just come to the front office and we will call your child for dismissal. Back-up notes are still necessary when your child has a change in transportation at the end of the day.

ABSENCES

Your child's absence is being recorded as an unknown and unexcused absence if you do not make a telephone call to the nurse's office. An absence note is not sufficient. The phone call must be made.

DRIVING CAUTION

When driving on the school grounds, please be mindful of our traffic patterns and be sure to proceed with caution.

MORNING ACTIVITIES DROP-OFFS

Only those children who have a scheduled morning activity may be dropped off before the 8:30AM start of school. We do not have the personnel to monitor students left here before this time.

AFTERNOON PICK-UP

For safety reasons, we ask that all children being picked up in the back circle wait in line until picked up. Children are not allowed to cross over the parking lot.

AFTERNOON ACTIVITIES - DISMISSAL

All students attending an after-school activity will be picked up at the back circle. Please follow the traffic pattern of the PM dismissal (reverse traffic flow). As always, the safety of our children is paramount. Children are not permitted to cross between cars or through the parking lots.

AFTERNOON BUILDING ACCESS

Please note there will be no access into the school after 4:15pm unless it has been previously arranged.

Dear Parents:

As you know, last year Cold Spring Harbor updated the format and structure of the Elementary Report Cards. We are now using our student management system, eSchoolData, to create the reports that you receive. **Beginning this marking period, parents will be able to access the report cards on the eSchoolData "Parent Portal"**. They will be posted and available on Thursday, March 20 by 5 PM.

If you already have a Parent Portal account in eSchoolData (for a child in the Jr./Sr. HS) you are already set up. If this is your first experience with the portal and need an account, please follow the instructions below:

Setting up an eSchoolData account:

Note: You only need to create <u>one</u> account to access the information for all of your children. In creating an account online, you will need to have the following information handy for <u>one</u> of your children:

- Parent/Guardian Name (apply using one parent's name only) and Student Name
- · Student ID Number (can be found on schedule/progress report/report card, also is their lunch system ID number)
- Student Grade Level (as of September 2013)
- School (as of September 2013)
 - I. Go to the CSH webpage (www.csh.k12.ny.us)
 - 2. Go to the pull down menu "For Parents" and click on "Parent Portal"
 - 3. Scroll all the way down to "How can I apply for access to the portal?" and click the blue link that begins with "You can apply for an account online." Click "Yes" on the pop-up window.
 - 4. The eSchoolData login screen will open. Click on "Online Registration" (bottom of the box).
 - 5. You will be asked to fill out information on three tabs, beginning with the Account Information portion (followed by Personal Information and Student Information).
 - 6. Once all parts have been filled out you will receive an automatically-generated email indicating that your registration information has been submitted. After the data has been reviewed, you will receive an additional email.

Getting the Report Card:

- 1. Log onto your account
- 2. Click on the ID number of your child
- 3. For grades K-5 click on the "ERC" tab
- 4. For grade 6 click on "Report Card" tab
- 5. Click print for a hard copy.

Please know that for the marking period ending this month, Elementary Report Cards will also be distributed at the March parent conferences. In June, the final report cards will be both posted on the portal and mailed home.

Dear Parents:

This is the time when planning for next year's **student placement** is in its initial stages. Our goal is to create balanced classes where all children can thrive academically and socially, while ensuring that district procedures are fair and equitable.

The process of creating classes is a complex one. It involves determining the best placement for each child and the best grouping of students in each classroom. All teachers who have an understanding of the academic and social needs of the students on each grade level have input into this process. Individual learning styles, peer relationships, behavior, and work habits are considered when determining the right placement for each child. In addition, we work carefully to ensure that classes have a balance of boys and girls and a range of abilities.

Parental input can be an important part of this process. If **your child** has **special needs** that are **not already known by his/her classroom teacher**, you may submit a <u>letter</u> to my attention by Monday, <u>April 7^h</u>. Since our process is extremely comprehensive, this will be your only opportunity to provide us with information.

Please note:

- Letters from past years are **not referred to or considered**.
- Letters must be sent to the main office (emails will not be considered).
- Requests for a specific teacher will not be honored and should not be included in a letter or discussion with a teacher.
- If your child's sibling had a particular teacher and you would like a different experience for this child, please include that information in your letter. Other requests will not be honored.
- Requests for placement with any specific child cannot be accepted.

We will give the same level of care and attention to the placement of every child, whether a parent letter is written or not. <u>Please understand that once the class assignments are mailed out in August, placements are final</u>.

I appreciate your confidence in the professional staff as we begin this important process. Thank you for your continued support of our efforts to create an educational environment where every child will be happy and successful.
