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★★★ SPECIAL RECOGNITION: LHS RECEIVES 'TRIPLE HONORS' ★★★

In the last few weeks, LHS has been recognized for three individual honors. The following awards have been announced to the students on LHTV Morning News. We would like to take this opportunity to share our these accomplishments with our families.

- I. LHS has been recognized by NYS Department of Education as a **Reward School**. This honor has been presented to us as a result of the high levels of achievements our students exhibit. The award certificate is attached.
- II. On October 26, 2013 LHS received the **Little Shelter Education Award**. This honor was presented to Ms. Massimo by Arleen Leone, Special Programs Supervisor, at the shelter's annual Costume Ball. The award was in recognition for being the first school on Long Island to host the "Reading to the Dogs" program. Our program is still going strong four years later and has expanded into other schools across both counties!
- III. Last Thursday, we were presented with the **2013 IPTVflix Award**. The presentation occurred at the November PTG meeting in front of parents, our student council officers (Hannah, Sarah, Kelly, and Aiden) and Advisors (Mr. Chiarello and Ms. Sganga), and Mr. Jon Salvia from our IT department. Peter Falotico and Joe Boccia explained the criteria for their selection, which included exemplary use of IPTVflix to improve school culture and climate. Thank you again to the LHSPTG board for their support with this initiative, which allows us to bring students our daily live broadcast of the Morning News show.
