



### The Waiver of Liability:

Recognizing the possibility of injury or damage to property associated with practicing or playing baseball or engaging in other Syosset Baseball Association ("SBA") activities, and in consideration for SBA accepting registration for my child's participation in SBA's program and activities, I hereby waive, release and discharge SBA, Syosset Baseball District, Town of Oyster Bay, sponsors, affiliated organizations, their respective employees, volunteers, supervisors, coordinators, board members, and any other personnel involved in any manner with SBA programs, practices, games or activities and any other person, body, entity, public or private, associated with SBA programs, practices, games or activities (including without limitation the owners, lessees, licensees, or administrators of fields and facilities utilized by SBA programs, practices, games, and/or other activities), and hereby indemnify SBA, from and against any and all claims, actions, losses, liabilities, fees or expenses in connection with registrant's participation in SBA programs, practices, games, and/or other activities, including without limitation, injury or property damage to the registrant, family members, spectators or any other person accompanying such registrant ("Participant") except and only to the extent that any medical coverage then carried by SBA determines that any medical expenses of such registrant are covered due to such injury and only to the extent of the amount determined to be payable by such carrier with respect to such injury. Nothing in the foregoing shall require SBA to carry any medical insurances or coverage for any registrant or any other person or party.

The signed parent and natural guardian on the registration form does hereby represent that he/she, is in fact, acting in such capacity and agrees to save and hold harmless and indemnify each and all parties referred to in The Waiver of Liability above from all liability, loss, cost, claim, or damage, whatsoever, which may be imposed upon said parties because of any defect in or lack of such capacity to so act and release said parties on behalf of the minor and the parents of legal guardian.
