

2015 SUMMER SCIENCE CAMPS

The DNA Learning Center (DNALC) of Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory is the world's first science center devoted entirely to genetics education. The DNALC "invented" DNA camps in 1985, and since then over 17,000 students have participated.



This summer, we offer fun and challenging camps for science enthusiasts entering 6th–12th grade at four locations: the **Dolan DNALC** and **Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory main campus** in Cold Spring Harbor; **DNALC** *West* in Lake Success; and *Harlem DNA Lab* in New York City. Guided by experienced instructors, students use sophisticated laboratory and computer equipment to perform experiments several grade levels ahead of their peers.

Fun with DNA (entering grade 6 or 7) immerses students in hands-on activities and experiments designed to build an understanding of cell biology, microbiology, genetics, and biotechnology.

World of Enzymes (entering grade 8 or Fun with DNA alumni entering grade 7) is an exploration of the use of enzymes in molecular biology as well as the food and health industries.

Green Genes (entering grade 9 or World of Enzymes alumni entering grade 8) introduces students to recombinant-DNA techniques used to manufacture human proteins such as insulin.

Forensic Detectives (entering grade 9) participants will experience forensics through a series of labs and activities in a more realistic fashion than portrayed on TV – it's not just DNA!

Backyard Barcoding (Green Genes alumni, entering grade 9) is an introduction to how DNA barcodes can be used to identify a species. Students learn how to use this information for both forensic identification and taxonomy.

DNA Science (entering grades 10-12) is a compilation of reliable lab experiments in molecular biology, which culminate in the construction and cloning of a recombinant DNA molecule.

Silencing Genomes (DNA Science alumni entering grades 11-12) explores the power of RNA interference (RNAi), a Nobel-prize winning discovery that has revolutionized how genes are studied.

BioCoding (DNA Science alumni entering grades 11-12) is an introductory course in bioinformatics and computer programing (coding) for students with little or no programing experience.

Genome Science (DNA Science alumni entering grade 11 or 12) integrates biochemical and computer methods used to analyze the genetic component of living things.

DNA Barcoding Research (DNA Science alumni entering grade 11 or 12) is a two-week independent research camp. Participants use DNA barcoding to survey the biodiversity of a specific ecosystem, and present their findings at a symposium.
