The fourth grade students at LHS visited Lloyd Manor House where the poet, Jupiter Hammon lived and worked as a slave. The students were inspired to write poetry after viewing Mr. Hammon's living quarters and learning about his lifestyle. Students had the opportunity to enter their poetry into a contest sponsored by the Lloyd Harbor Historical Society. The name of the contest was called the *Jupiter Hammon Poetry Contest*. Lloyd Harbor School had four "winners":

FIRST PLACE: "Slaves" by **Anna Maria Fernandez**

SECOND PLACE: "Love Is Everything" by **Brooke Antolin**

THIRD PLACE: "Stuck In A Time Of Slavery" by **Annabelle Bryant**

FOURTH PLACE: **Madison Porcelain**

Final judging was made by Dr. Cedrick May, Associate Professor English Department, Texas Christian University, who said "It was the 4th grade poems that stood out overall as superior in their construction and thoughtfulness. Their teachers ought to be proud of themselves for producing such wonderful poets!" Additionally, Mrs. Caputo is being recognized as "outstanding teacher of poetry". There is a reception next month which will take place at the Henry Lloyd Manor House.
