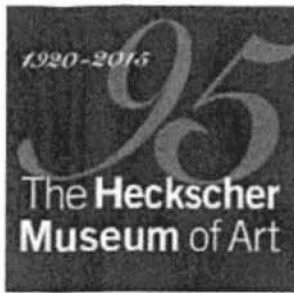

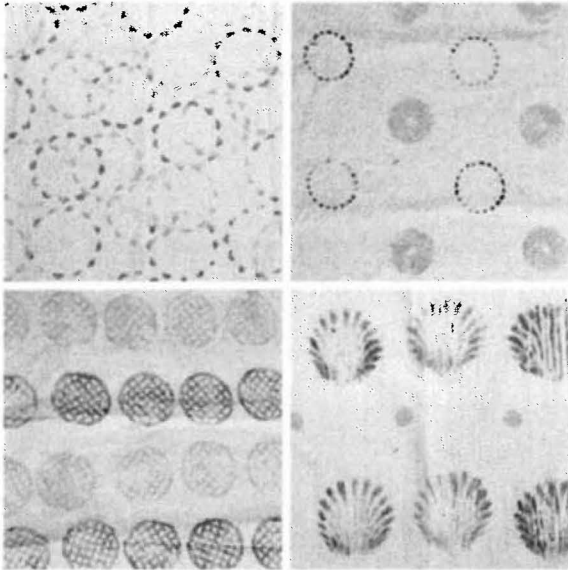

For tween girls in grades 5-6

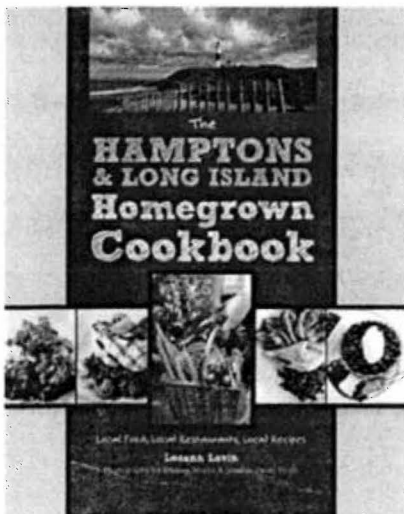
