

Christopher picks his volunteers right from the audience as part of the show, so no one knows what student might be going home with a painted face or an adventurous story to tell.

Some Information for You:

- <u>The Makeup:</u> we only use non-toxic, theatrical makeup. It's comfortable, dries quickly and meets all US safety standards for children's makeup. This is the same high quality makeup we have used for twenty years painting faces in the NY area at places such as the Bronx Zoo and Coney Island Aquarium. - Washes off with soap and water: the make-up washes off easily from faces, hands, clothes, anything with simple soap and water. (Wet the child's face to soften the makeup then wash with soap and water with a soft towel, and rinse off -- you don't need to scrub hard.)
- It doesn't hurt: The makeup is applied with sponges and soft brushes. It may tickle, but it won't hurt. Once it dries, you hardly know it's on your face.

It's so safe kids can eat with it on, and we encourage them to wear their face through the school day so everyone gets to see how they look.
